B. PERTEMUAN PENDAHULUAN GRUP REGIONAL

1. ASEAN+3 Meeting

Chair: Hon. Vu Hai Ha, *Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the National Assembly of Vietnam*

Participants: Indonesia, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Thailand, & Vietnam

Kata Sambutan oleh Chair ASEAN+3

Chair menggaris bawahi upaya yang telah dilakukan oleh seluruh negara anggota dalam melawan pandemi Covid-19 dengan tetap berpegang kepada multilateralisme dan diplomasi parlemen untuk pemulihan pasca pandemi yang berkelanjutan.

Adopsi Laporan Pertemuan Sebelumnya

Laporan pertemuan sebelumnya yang diselenggarakan secara virtual pada 20 April 2020, yang dipimpin oleh H.E. Chuan Leekpai, *President of the National Assembly of the Kingdom of Thailand*.

Vacancies yang dapat diisi pada 143rd IPU Assembly

Tidak adak posisi yang diajukan. Hanya saja rapat menginformasikan terkait penggantian anggota yang berasal dari Thailand pada *Standing Committee on Sustainable Development*, dan pencalonan Indonesia pada *Committee on Middle East Question*. Pencalonan tersebut didukung oleh ASEAN+3

Cambodia akan menjadi Chair pada pertemuan ASEAN+3, 144th IPU Assembly, Maret 2022.

Lainnya

Indonesia menyambut seluruh delegasi untuk hadir pada General Assembly berikutnya, di Bali.

2. Asia-Pacific Group (APG) Meeting

Chair: Hon. Song, Ki-Hun, Member of the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea

Participants: Mongolia, Japan, Thailand, Australia, China, Cambodia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Canada, Malaysia, India, & Vietnam

Kata sambutan oleh *Chair of APG 2021*

Pertemuan dibuka oleh *Chair* yang menyatakan rasa terima kasihnya kepada seluruh delegasi yang hadir, walaupun akibat pandemi Covid-19 terpaksa diadakan secara virtual. Selanjutnya *Chair* menyatakan bahwa pandemi Covid-19 ini telah meningkatkan rasa saling curiga dan konflik, yang dapat mengancam demokrasi yang telah dengan susah payah kita bangun. Dia menekankan pada peran penting parlemen dalam membangun solidaritas dan kerja sama antar-negara, termasuk penekanan pada peran penting Korea di kawasan Asia-Pasifik.

Adopsi Agenda Pertemuan

Agenda pertemuan yang diajukan dapat diterima dan tidak ada yang keberatan.

Adopsi Laporan Pertemuan Sebelumnya

Laporan pertemuan sebelumnya, yang diselenggarakan pada tanggal 7 Mei 2021 diadopsi dan tidak ada yang keberatan.

Laporan Perwakilan APG di *Executive Committee IPU*

Mewakili ketiga perwakilan APG di *Executive Committee*, yaitu China, Pakistan, dan Thailand, Hon. Pikulkaew Krairiksh, melaporkan hasil pertemuan yang diadakan oleh *Executive Committee*. Beberapa hasil yang dicapai, yaitu:

- *Strategy 2022 – 2026 IPU: Executive Committee* menerima beberapa pilar utama terpenting dari strategi baru, termasuk terkait alokasi sumber daya di dalam rancangan anggaran IPU tahun 2022.
- Keanggotaan Universal IPU, dimana IPU akan mendorong keanggotaan seluas mungkin kepada parlemen negara-negara di seluruh dunia.
- Kondisi di beberapa negara anggota IPU, seperti: Afghanistan, Cambodia, Myanmar, Sudan, Tunisia, dan Yemen, yang akan diajukan menjadi agenda utama di *Governing Council*.
- *Sub-Committee on Finance*: Dengan mempertimbangkan situasi pandemi Covid-19, memutuskan untuk tidak meningkatkan kontribusi anggota untuk tahun 2022 (total anggaran untuk tahun 2021, berjumlah 10.9 juta CHF). Voluntary Contribution untuk tahun 2022, diprediksi berjumlah 5.3 Juta CHF, diantaranya berasal dari, *Canadian Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade, and Development*, yang akan difokuskan pada beberapa isu spesifik. Kerja sama juga diupayakan untuk ditingkatkan dengan beberapa donor potensial lainnya.

Laporan oleh ASEAN+3 Group

Hon. Don Tuan Phong, *Vice-Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam* memberikan laporan terkait hasil rapat ASEAN+3 meeting yang diselenggarakan pada 23 November, 2021, 15.30, sebelum *APG meeting*.

Vacancies yang dapat diisi pada 143rd IPU Assembly mewakili APG

Terdapat dua posisi yang dapat diisi oleh perwakilan dari APG, yaitu:

- *Bureau of Women Parliamentarians*: Mongolia telah mengajukan kandidat, yaitu Hon. Undram Chinbat. Karena tidak ada keberatan atas pencalonannya, maka dia dapat dinominasikan secara konsensus.
- *High-Level Advisory Group on Countering Terrorism*: Tidak ada yang mengajukan diri untuk mengisi posisi ini.
- *Standing Committee on Sustainable Development*: Thailand mengajukan diri untuk mengisi posisi ini, yang akan menggantikan Hon. Issara Sereewatthanawut dengan Hon. Kraissid Tontisirin, sebagai perwakilan

parlemen Thailand. Karena tidak keberatan atas hal ini, maka penggantian dapat dilakukan.

Pengumuman terkait Chair Asia-Pacific Group untuk tahun 2022

Chair APG dipilih berdasarkan urutan alfabetikal, dan Korea telah menjajaki beberapa negara, seperti Samoa, Singapore, Sri Lanka, dan Thailand, yang mana negara-negara tersebut menolak posisi tersebut. Karena itulah posisi tersebut masih terbuka bagi negara-negara di urutan alfabetis berikutnya.

Lainnya

Beberapa waktu sebelum pertemuan ini diadakan, Indonesia telah menginformasikan terkait pencalonan Hon. Mardani Ali Sera sebagai anggota *Committee on Middle East Question*. Walaupun pencalonan atas posisi ini tidak mewakili APG, kesempatan tetap diberikan untuk memaparkan posisi Indonesia terkait isu ini. Hon. Mardani meminta dukungan APG atas pencalonan ini.

Chair juga menginformasikan bahwa Azerbaijan mengajukan diri untuk bergabung di dalam APG. Tetapi karena tidak ada tindak lanjut terkait hal ini, maka keputusan akan diserahkan kepada pertemuan selanjutnya.

C. RANGKAIAN PERTEMUAN UTAMA

1. Inaugural Ceremony

Yang Mulia Felipe VI, Raja Spanyol membuka *Inaugural Ceremony* yang diselenggarakan di IFEMA Palacio Municipal, Madrid pada pukul 18.30. Ia menyambut seluruh delegasi dan menyatakan belasungkawanya atas korban meninggal akibat Covid-19 selama tahun 2020. Sebagai salah satu negara yang pertama kali diakui sebagai tempat lahirnya parlemen modern, Raja Felipe VI menyatakan bahwa dialog antar bangsa dan institusi merupakan dasar untuk membangun kesepahaman dan kerja sama.

H.E. Meritxell Batet Lamana, President of the Congress of Deputies of Spain menyambut seluruh delegasi yang hadir di Madrid. Ia menyatakan, sebagai tuan rumah persidangan kali ini, Parlemen Spanyol akan berupaya keras dalam memastikan persidangan kali ini berjalan dalam kondisi yang seaman mungkin di tengah pandemi Covid-19. Pandemi ini sendiri telah meningkatkan ketidakpuasan publik dan mengancam institusi demokratis. Ketidakpuasan juga meningkatkan polarisasi dan ekstrimisme di tengah masyarakat, karena itulah tema tahun ini mengangkat *“Contemporary challenges to democracy: Overcoming division and building community”*.

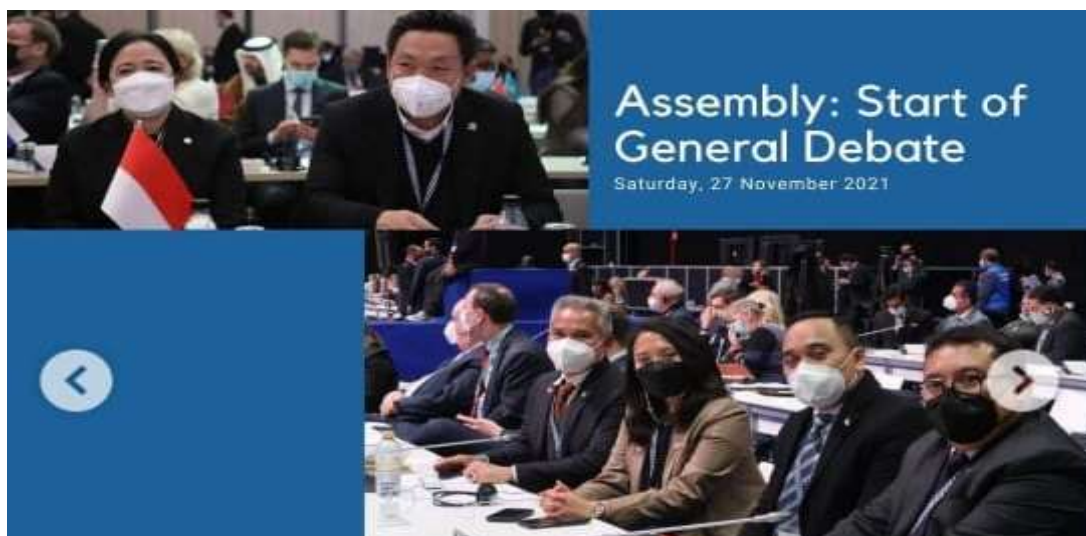

2. General Assembly

Persidangan kali ini dihadiri oleh 117 Parlemen anggota IPU. Di samping para anggota parlemen, juga hadir delegasi dengan status *observer* baik dari organisasi parlemen regional maupun *Non-Governmental Organization (NGO)*. Dari 936 delegasi yang hadir, 515 merupakan anggota parlemen.

Debat umum kali ini membahas lima usulan *emergency item*, yaitu:

- *Global parliamentary support for the humanitarian situation of the Palestinians (Indonesia);*
- *Stopping human trafficking, halting human rights abuses and working towards free and fair elections in Belarus (Germany, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Poland, Ukraine, and the United Kingdom);*
- *Impetus to regional development of countries with high levels of international migration (Mexico);*
- *The vital necessity of ensuring uninterrupted parliamentary activities during pandemics (Russian Federation);*
- *Harnessing global parliamentary support for vaccine equity in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic (African Group).*

3. Governing Council

Pada pertemuan pada tanggal 27 November, *Governing Council* mengajukan President Parlemen Spanyol, Ms. Batet Lamana untuk dipilih menjadi Presiden Sidang IPU ke-143.

Pertemuan *Governing Council* mendukung inisiatif President IPU untuk memperluas keanggotaan IPU. *Governing Council* mendukung segala upaya yang dilakukan untuk mensukseskan upaya ini.

Governing Council juga mengadopsi Strategi IPU untuk tahun 2022. Strategi yang disusun tersebut merupakan hasil diskusi yang dipimpin oleh *IPU Executive Committee*, di bawah kepemimpinan Presiden IPU. Berbagai masukan yang diterima, lebih jauh diproses oleh Sekretariat IPU dan *Sub-Committee on Finance*. Beberapa strategi yang telah ditetapkan antara lain:

- Membangun parlemen yang kuat dan efektif.
- Mempromosikan parlemen yang inklusif dan representative.
- Mendukung parlemen yang inovatif.
- Mendorong aksi kolektif parlemen.
- Memperkuat akuntabilitas IPU.

Governing Council juga menyusun prioritas terkait kebijakan apa yang menjadi fokus tahun ini, antara lain:

- Perubahan Iklim.
- Demokrasi, Hak Asasi Manusia, Kesetaraan Jender, dan Partisipasi Pemuda.
- Keamanan dan Perdamaian.
- Pembangunan Berkelanjutan untuk semua.

Sidang *Governing Council* juga membahas rancangan anggaran untuk satu tahun ke depan. Tidak ada peningkatan jumlah kontribusi di dalam proposal anggaran. Sekretariat IPU juga mengupayakan untuk menambah jumlah donator eksternal terkait pembiayaan operasional IPU. Dana dari donatur eksternal tersebut telah mencapai sekita 25% dari anggaran tahunan IPU.

4. Bureau of Women Parliamentarian

Pertemuan *Bureau of Women Parliamentarian* dipimpin oleh *Presiden Forum of Women Parliamentarians*, **Hon. Lesia Vasylenko**, dari Ukraina. Pertemuan dihadiri anggota *Bureau* dari Mali, Benin, Bahrain, Mesir, Syria, Indonesia, Rusia, Belarus, Ekuador, Ukraina, dan Perancis.

Pertemuan *Bureau* dilaksanakan dua kali pada tanggal 26 November 2021 (*First Seating*) dan tanggal 29 November 2021 (*Second Seating*). *First Seating* dimaksudkan untuk finalisasi persiapan *Forum of Women Parliamentarians* yang dilaksanakan pada hari yang sama setelah pertemuan *Bureau*. *Second Seating* dimaksudkan untuk melakukan evaluasi atas penyelenggaraan *Forum of*

Women Parliamentarians dan membahas persiapan agenda kegiatan Forum ini di Sidang ke-144 IPU.

Terkait evaluasi penyelenggaraan *Forum of Women Parliamentarians*, mayoritas anggota *Bureau* menyampaikan cukup puas atas kinerja yang dicapai. *Forum of Women Parliamentarians* membahas usulan resolusi yang disampaikan *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights* dari perspektif perempuan dan anak-anak. Rekomendasi berisi usulan amandemen resolusi secara tertulis telah disampaikan kepada *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights*. Usulan tersebut telah dibahas dan diakomodasi sesuai kebutuhan.

Untuk agenda di Sidang ke-144 dan ke-145 IPU, *Bureau of Women Parliamentarians* memutuskan mendukung usulan-usulan agenda yang telah masuk. *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights* mengusulkan agenda “*Parliamentary impetus to local and regional development of countries with high levels of international migration and to stopping all forms, including state sponsored, of human trafficking and human rights abuses*”.

Untuk Sidang ke-144 IPU bulan Maret 2022, *Standing Committee on Sustainable Development* mengusulkan agenda “*Leveraging Information and Communication Technology as an enabler for the education sector, including in times of pandemic*”. *Standing Committee on Peace and International Security* mengusulkan agenda “*Rethinking and reframing approaches to peace processes with a view to fostering lasting peace*”.

Anggota *Bureau of Women Parliamentarians*, **Puteri Anetta Komarudin**, dipilih untuk memimpin pembahasan agenda “*Leveraging Information and Communication Technology as an enabler for the education sector, including in times of pandemic*”.

Terkait persiapan Sidang ke-144 IPU di Indonesia, terdapat berbagai usulan sebagai berikut:

- a. Struktur dan manajemen debat panel. Debat mengadopsi **Davos Style**. Alokasi waktu untuk intervensi di debat panel selama 3 menit dengan struktur 2 menit untuk *country experience* dan 1 menit untuk rekomendasi. Intervensi diikuti dengan *follow up question* dari *Chair* selama 1 menit.
- b. Pertemuan di Bali nanti agar semaksimal mungkin ramah lingkungan dan mengurangi sampah plastik.

- c. Mempertimbangkan agenda yang memungkinkan interaksi antara anggota parlemen senior dan anggota parlemen muda. Semacam *mentoring*.
- d. Penggunaan aplikasi untuk memudahkan anggota IPU menyusun agenda kegiatan pribadi selama Sidang dan saling terkoneksi satu sama lain.
- e. Mempertimbangkan untuk mengadakan *workshop* isu yang diusulkan Parlemen Maladewa di *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights*.
- f. Pertemuan dengan *UN Officials* dan kunjungan lapangan untuk melihat implementasi program terkait isu gender dan *circular economy*.
- g. Pertemuan dengan parlemen setempat (DPRD).
- h. *Workshop* untuk isu-isu gender termasuk isu maternal, neonatal, child health. **Puteri Anetta Komarudin** telah melaksanakan pertemuan dengan perwakilan WHO di Madrid terkait hal ini dan agar dilakukan tindak lanjut.
- i. *Working luncheon*.

Bureau of Women Parliamentarians juga memutuskan untuk mendukung perpanjangan penunjukan Sekretaris Jenderal IPU, **Mr. Martin Chungong**.

Anggota *Bureau* dari Uni Emirat Arab, Hon. Meera Alsuwaidi, menyampaikan undangan bagi seluruh anggota *Bureau* untuk berkunjung ke negaranya dan memantau Expo 2020 Dubai yang diselenggarakan mulai 1 Oktober 2021 – 31 Mar 2022 . Parlemen Uni Emirat Arab bersedia memfasilitasi kunjungan tersebut.

Pertemuan diakhiri dengan perkenalan dengan perwakilan IPU di Wina, Austria yang menangani isu gender, dan bekerjasama dengan UN Women. Sekretariat IPU juga menyampaikan update mengenai agenda IPU ke depan yaitu “*Parliamentary Hearing at the UN and the annual Parliamentary Meeting on the occasion of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)*”. Untuk *International Women’s Day 2022*, IPU akan mengeluarkan publikasi mengenai *Women in Parliament*.

5. Bureau on Democracy and Human Rights

Pertemuan dipimpin oleh **Hon. Didier Marie** dari Perancis, dan dihadiri anggota *Bureau* dari Indonesia, Maladewa, Uzbekistan, Uruguay, Swedia dan Jerman. Indonesia diwakili oleh **Dr. Fadli Zon** sebagai anggota *Bureau*.

Terdapat 6 proposal resolusi untuk *IPU 145th Assembly* yang diterima Bureau sebelum tenggat waktu tanggal 28 November 2021. Usulan-usulan tersebut adalah:

- a. *Parliamentary impetus to local and regional development of countries with high levels of international migration and to stopping all forms, including state sponsored, of human trafficking and human rights abuses*, diusulkan Jerman.
- b. *Strengthening democracy: Enhancing interface between parliaments and citizens*, diusulkan India.
- c. *Catalyzing collective parliamentary action: Eliminating female genital mutilation: Adopting legislative measures to eliminate female genital mutilation*, diusulkan Maladewa.
- d. *Inadmissibility of sanctions against parliamentarians*, diusulkan oleh Rusia.
- e. *Legislation as an instrument to strengthen community care and social protection systems in relation to confinement and mental health*, diusulkan oleh Uruguay.

Indonesia memutuskan untuk mendukung usulan dari Jerman karena *human trafficking* merupakan masalah bersama yang harus diatasi. Mengingat juga *human trafficking* sangat terkait dengan masalah fundamental lainnya termasuk migran dan pengungsi.

Terkait tema debat, terdapat dua usulan, yaitu:

- a. *Human rights violations of women and girls in Afghanistan*, diusulkan Siprus.
- b. *The role of parliaments in reconciling health measures during a pandemic with the preservation of civil liberties*, diusulkan Perancis.

Indonesia memutuskan mendukung usulan dari Perancis.

Bureau memutuskan untuk mengadopsi usulan resolusi Jerman. Usulan tema debat dari Perancis untuk diajukan ke sesi kedua *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights* yang akan diselenggarakan pada hari Senin, 29 November 2021 pukul 17:00.

Catatan:

Dr. Fadli Zon diminta menjadi *co-rapporteur* usulan resolusi "*Parliamentary impetus to local and regional development of countries with high levels of international migration and to stopping all forms, including state sponsored, of human trafficking and human rights abuses*" oleh Belarus. Resolusi ini akan

dibahas pada 145th IPU Assembly yang akan diselenggarakan pada bulan Oktober 2022 di Rwanda.

6. *Forum of Women Parliamentarian*

Parity Debate: Are Men and Women MPs Equally Engaged in Gender Equality?

Agenda *Forum of Women Parliamentarians* (FoWP) yang sebelumnya telah mengadakan pertemuan dan diskusi panel pada 26 November 2021, berlanjut pada 29 November 2021. Kali ini, forum menyelenggarakan *Parity Debate* dengan tema “*Are Men and Women MPs Equally Engaged in Gender Equality?*” – yang secara umum fokus pada pembahasan terkait bagaimana anggota parlemen laki-laki dapat turut terlibat aktif, mendukung, dan mendorong kesetaraan gender yang lebih efektif. Debat ini mempertemukan delegasi parlemen perempuan dan laki-laki, dengan mengundang beberapa perwakilan anggota parlemen untuk menyampaikan pandangan dan pengalaman di negara mereka masing-masing, termasuk Anggota BKSAP DPR RI **Ibu Puteri Anetta Komarudin**.

Sesi debat ini dihadiri oleh 45 peserta, termasuk 30 anggota parlemen dari 21 negara. Tujuan utama dari penyelenggaraan sesi debat ini ialah untuk membahas berbagai langkah dalam pelibatan laki-laki, khususnya sesama anggota parlemen, dan kemitraan yang strategis dalam mencapai kesetaraan gender. Terdapat tiga mosi dalam debat ini, yakni:

- *It is easy for men MPs to speak out in support of gender equality;*

- *Gender Equality is a women's issue;* dan
- *To better engage in work toward gender equality, men MPs need to acknowledge that they are both part of the problem and part of the solution.*

Ibu Puteri Komaruddin turut menyampaikan argumennya dalam *parity debate* ini, di mana beliau setuju dengan mosi pertama dan ketiga, serta tidak setuju dengan mosi kedua. Pada mosi pertama, Ibu Puteri membawa argumen bahwa jumlah laki-laki yang mendukung kesetaraan gender mulai meningkat di Indonesia, terlebih semakin banyaknya dialog terkait gender dengan berbagai isu yang saling berhubungan. Agar dapat mendobrak berbagai hambatan bagi perempuan dalam proses politik (diskriminasi, resistensi partai politik, lemahnya penegakan hukum, kepercayaan masyarakat terhadap pemimpin perempuan); diperlukan dukungan anggota parlemen laki-laki yang sebagian besar masih memegang kendali dalam kepemimpinan partai politik dan perwakilan daerah. Pada mosi kedua, argumen yang disampaikan ialah bahwa untuk dapat mengarusutamakan dan membawa perubahan menuju keterwakilan, kepemimpinan, dan sistem yang lebih setara di parlemen, semua anggota harus bekerja sama, baik perempuan maupun laki-laki. Pemberdayaan perempuan di Indonesia akan memberikan pertumbuhan yang signifikan dan sangat penting untuk pemulihan ekonomi negara; di mana hanya dengan meningkatkan 25% tenaga kerja perempuan pada tahun 2025, diproyeksikan dapat menghasilkan tambahan sebesar \$62 miliar dalam kegiatan ekonomi dan meningkatkan PDB sebesar 2,9%. Sementara argumen pada mosi ketiga ialah adanya urgensi untuk menggeser dinamika kekuasaan yang timpang antara laki-laki dan perempuan serta mendorong perubahan perilaku; yang harus dimulai oleh pengakuan dan kesadaran laki-laki bahwa mereka adalah bagian dari masalah sekaligus bagian dari solusi. Pelibatan laki-laki sebagai sekutu/aliansi dalam upaya mendorong kesetaraan gender adalah kunci untuk mencapai Tujuan ke-5 SDGs. Melalui berbagai pengaruh, kuasa, dan *privilege* mereka, laki-laki memiliki kemampuan untuk menggeser norma-norma dan ide-ide dominan tentang gender dan maskulinitas. Dengan mengakui bahwa mereka adalah bagian dari masalah, laki-laki juga dapat turut menentang patriarki dan struktur yang mendorong ketimpangan gender.

Selain argumen yang disampaikan oleh Ibu Puteri, pada debat ini para delegasi juga sepakat bahwa kesetaraan gender adalah isu sosial yang universal, yang harus bersama-sama didukung oleh anggota seluruh anggota parlemen, baik laki-laki maupun perempuan. Laki-laki yang tidak mengakui hak istimewa historis mereka adalah bagian dari masalah, termasuk pula mentalitas dan perilaku yang

melanggengkan stereotip. Diskusi yang juga mengemuka ialah anggota parlemen laki-laki yang memperjuangkan kesetaraan gender harus melakukannya dengan tekad yang kuat; terlebih ketika mendukung kesetaraan gender, mereka dapat menghadapi intimidasi dari rekan sesama laki-laki, seperti yang juga sering terjadi dengan anggota parlemen perempuan yang membela kesetaraan gender.

Para delegasi juga menggarisbawahi beberapa praktik baik di parlemen negara mereka untuk meningkatkan partisipasi aktif laki-laki dalam memajukan kesetaraan gender, seperti: mengadakan rapat/debat umum tahunan spesifik terkait kondisi, status dan kemajuan kesetaraan gender di parlemen; memastikan dimensi gender dan menekankan manfaat kesetaraan pada topik-topik ekonomi, pertahanan dan keamanan; memastikan partisipasi yang seimbang antara laki-laki dan perempuan di komisi, panel, dan rapat dengar pendapat di parlemen; serta dialog dengan para pemimpin agama dengan fokus menyoroti bagaimana praktik keagamaan dapat mencerminkan kesetaraan gender.

Menutup sesi debat, forum kemudian merekomendasikan bahwa memajukan kesetaraan gender harus menjadi bagian dari upaya global untuk memerangi segala bentuk diskriminasi dan ketimpangan, guna mencapai pembangunan yang berkelanjutan dan *leaving no one behind*.

7. Forum of Women Parliamentarian

Panel Discussion: Strategies for Gender-Responsive Law Making

The 32nd Session of the Forum of Women Parliamentarians (FoWP) dalam Sidang IPU ke-143 diselenggarakan pada 26 November 2021. Forum ini dihadiri oleh 197 delegasi, yang terdiri dari 114 anggota parlemen dari 62 negara dan perwakilan dari berbagai organisasi internasional. Salah satu rangkaian kegiatan dalam forum ini ialah diskusi panel, bertajuk “*Strategies for Gender-Responsive Law Making.*” Pada diskusi ini, Anggota BKSAP DPR RI Ibu Puteri Anetta Komarudin diundang untuk menjadi salah satu pembicara panel.

Forum dibuka oleh Presiden Bureau of Women Parliamentarians, **Hon. Lesia Vasylenko (Ukraina)**; dilanjutkan dengan pemilihan **Hon. Meritxell Batet Lamaña (Spanyol)** untuk memimpin sidang FoWP ke-32. Agenda pembukaan dilanjutkan dengan pidato sambutan dari Presiden IPU **Hon. Duarte Pacheco**, dan Perdana Menteri Spanyol **Pedro Sánchez**. Sekretaris Jenderal IPU, **Mr. Martin Chungong**, juga turut hadir dalam sesi tersebut.

Agenda selanjutnya ialah kontribusi FoWP bagi Sidang IPU ke-143, yakni pembahasan draf resolusi yang akan disahkan dalam sidang umum terkait *“Legislation worldwide to combat online child sexual exploitation and abuse”* dari sudut pandang gender. Setelah pemaparan singkat oleh **Hon. Arda Gerkens** (Belanda) selaku *co-rapporteur*, forum kemudian dibagi menjadi dua kelompok untuk membahas aspek-aspek spesifik dari draf resolusi. Kelompok pertama membahas topik *“Gender-responsive and survivor-centred legislation,”* sementara kelompok kedua mendiskusikan *“Age and gender-sensitive strategies to empower and educate children to protect themselves and report online sexual exploitation.”* Forum kemudian menghasilkan satu usulan amandemen, dan mendukung beberapa amandemen yang diusulkan oleh delegasi sebagai kontribusi bagi draf resolusi dari perspektif gender.

Forum dilanjutkan dengan agenda diskusi panel, yang fokus pada pembahasan terkait peran parlemen dalam memastikan kerangka kebijakan nasional untuk

menjamin kesetaraan gender. Selain Ibu Puteri Komaruddin mewakili BKSAP DPR RI, panelis lain dalam diskusi ini ialah:

- Hon. Hala Ramzi Fayez (*MP, Bahrain Shura Council*)
- Hon. Espérance Nyirasafari (*MP, Parliament of Rwanda*)
- Hon. Claudia Mix Jiménez (*MP, Chamber of Deputies of Chile*)

Diskusi dibuka dengan video dari *UN Women* dan pidato pembuka dari Sekretaris Jenderal IPU, Mr. Martin Chungong, yang juga merupakan *Chair of the International Gender Champions Global Board*. Melalui pidatonya, Mr. Chungong memperkenalkan buku panduan yang baru saja diluncurkan atas kerja sama IPU dan *UN Women*, terkait pedoman bagi anggota parlemen dalam merumuskan undang-undang yang responsif gender. Buku panduan tersebut telah disusun berdasarkan berbagai praktik terbaik dan kontribusi dari para anggota parlemen di seluruh dunia.

Panelis pertama, **Hon. Fayez**, memaparkan mengenai manfaat dan tantangan dalam menjalankan reformasi hukum yang responsif gender. Panelis selanjutnya, **Hon. Jiménez**, menyampaikan paparan terkait mekanisme dan kapasitas yang dibutuhkan bagi parlemen dalam pengarusutamaan gender.

Ibu Puteri Komaruddin kemudian memaparkan perspektif dan pengalaman Indonesia, khususnya Kaukus Perempuan Parlemen di DPR RI dalam membangun kemitraan dan aliansi untuk mendukung pengambilan kebijakan yang responsif gender. Ia menjelaskan bahwa DPR RI telah melembagakan kaukus perempuan yang fokus pada program pemberdayaan politik perempuan melalui dua strategi utama, yaitu advokasi dan peningkatan kapasitas. Fokus advokasi kaukus ini ialah mendorong 30% keterwakilan perempuan di lembaga politik dan partai politik, sementara peningkatan kapasitas dilakukan untuk meningkatkan kemampuan politik dan legislatif para anggota kaukus. Ibu Puteri juga menjelaskan bahwa kaukus ini telah menjangkau dan melibatkan berbagai organisasi masyarakat sipil, akademisi, dan sektor swasta dalam melaksanakan program dan kegiatan pemberdayaan perempuan; khususnya terkait peran perempuan dalam kepemimpinan, pemeliharaan perdamaian, lingkungan, penanggulangan kemiskinan, pernikahan anak, kekerasan dalam rumah tangga, serta isu ketenagakerjaan. Kaukus Perempuan juga menyediakan forum *multi-stakeholder* terkait advokasi legislasi.

Poin penting dari proses yang dimiliki oleh Kaukus Perempuan DPR RI, menurut Ibu Puteri, adalah keterbukaan dan ketersediaan platform pelibatan berbagai

pihak terkait untuk mendukung reformasi hukum yang lebih responsif gender. Hal ini menjadi sangat penting, karena keterbukaan parlemen dan peningkatan partisipasi publik merupakan salah satu aspek dasar dalam menciptakan reformasi dan memetakan kepentingan yang responsif gender, berdasarkan konteks masyarakat Indonesia. Mengakhiri paparannya, Ibu Puteri menyerukan pentingnya kolaborasi dan saling berbagi pengalaman, baik dalam kerangka kerja sama IPU, maupun melalui berbagai forum regional dan internasional lainnya seperti *Eurasia Women Forum (EAWF)* dan *Women Political Leader (WPL) Summit*.

Memasuki sesi diskusi terbuka dan tanya-jawab, para delegasi berbagi pengalaman dari negaranya masing-masing sekaligus menyerukan pentingnya mengadopsi legislasi yang menegaskan hak untuk melindungi perempuan. Perlunya peran parlemen dalam melakukan tinjauan terhadap implementasi dan dampak legislasi tersebut secara reguler juga dibahas dalam diskusi ini. Secara umum, diskusi ini fokus pada pembahasan terkait berbagai legislasi dan kebijakan dalam bidang keluarga dan perkawinan, kepemilikan tanah, pekerjaan dan kesetaraan upah, kewarganegaraan, serta penghapusan segala bentuk kekerasan terhadap perempuan.

Beberapa strategi yang dinilai berhasil dan mengemuka dalam diskusi ini antara lain upaya pembangunan aliansi, pendekatan gender dalam mekanisme parlemen, serta meningkatkan kapasitas dalam upaya pengarusutamaan gender. Para delegasi juga menekankan efektivitas mekanisme parlemen seperti komisi khusus terkait kesetaraan gender, dan kaukus parlemen perempuan. Menutup diskusi panel ini, para delegasi sepakat mengenai pentingnya pengawasan terhadap implementasi undang-undang dan pengawasan anggaran melalui perspektif dan pendekatan gender, serta proses penganggaran yang responsif gender.

8. *Forum of Young Parliamentarians*

Forum of Young Parliamentarians (FoYP) pada Sidang IPU ke-143 ini diselenggarakan pada hari kedua rangkaian kegiatan, yakni 27 November 2021. Forum yang dibentuk untuk meningkatkan partisipasi generasi muda dalam lembaga legislatif ini dikhususkan bagi anggota parlemen berusia di bawah 45 tahun. Delegasi BKSAP DPR RI yang hadir dalam sidang ini ialah Anggota BKSAP **Ibu Puteri Anetta Komarudin**.

Sesi ini dipimpin oleh dua *co-chairs*, **Hon. Olha Rudenko (Ukraina)** dan **Hon. M.A. Rakotomalala (Madagaskar)**; keduanya merupakan anggota *Board of the Forum of Young Parliamentarians*, menggantikan *President of the Board* **Hon. Sahar Albazar (Mesir)** dan anggota *Board* termuda **Hon. Maria Vasilevich (Belarus)**, yang berhalangan hadir secara fisik dalam forum ini. Bertindak sebagai *rappporteur* dalam sesi ini ialah delegasi dari Parlemen Jerman, Hon. Ulrich Lechte. Forum ini dihadiri oleh 72 peserta, termasuk 59 anggota parlemen dari 45 negara. Sebanyak 44% dari peserta forum ini ialah anggota parlemen perempuan, dengan rerata usia seluruh peserta ialah 38 tahun.

Forum dibuka dengan sambutan dari Presiden IPU, **Hon. Duarte Pacheco**, dan Sekretaris Jenderal IPU, **Mr. Martin Chungong**, yang menyampaikan dukungan mereka terhadap partisipasi generasi muda di parlemen. Pada sesi ini, anggota forum juga mengapresiasi dukungan dari pimpinan IPU, sekaligus menyatakan dukungan terhadap pengangkatan Mr. Chungong yang kembali diberikan mandat sebagai Sekjen IPU untuk masa jabatan periode baru. Setelah dibuka, forum dilanjutkan dengan pemaparan mengenai *update* terkait partisipasi generasi muda di tingkat global dan di masing-masing parlemen nasional. Perwakilan *Board* kemudian memaparkan rangkuman kinerja IPU sejak Mei 2021 dalam mendukung partisipasi pemuda, serta rencana aktivitas di tahun 2022.

Agenda selanjutnya ialah kontribusi FoYP bagi Sidang IPU ke-143, terkait tema yang dibahas dalam *general debate* dan *draft resolution* yang tengah disusun.

Meninjau tema utama sidang umum, *Contemporary Challenges to Democracy: Overcoming Division and Building Community*, para delegasi sepakat bahwa demokrasi yang kuat harus lebih inklusif dan responsif terhadap generasi muda. Selain itu, gerakan parlemen muda IPU juga memberikan kontribusinya melalui kampanye “*I Say Yes to Youth in Parliament*,” yang telah berhasil mengumpulkan dukungan lebih dari 500 anggota parlemen dan pemimpin politik di seluruh dunia.

Forum ini juga menggarisbawahi pentingnya peran anggota parlemen muda serta kontribusinya dalam kerja sama, kesepakatan, dan aliansi lintas generasi. Pentingnya peran mereka dalam membangun parlemen yang lebih responsif terhadap generasi muda juga ditekankan pada sesi diskusi ini. Sementara terkait resolusi IPU tentang *Legislation Worldwide to Combat Online Child Sexual Exploitation and Abuse*, perspektif muda dalam FoYP menyoroti perlunya kerja sama, kriminalisasi terhadap berbagai bentuk eksploitasi seksual daring, serta peningkatan upaya untuk menempatkan anak-anak sebagai subjek penting dalam kerangka kebijakan.

Memasuki sesi diskusi terbuka, para delegasi saling bertukar informasi tentang kemajuan dalam meningkatkan partisipasi generasi muda di negara masing-masing; serta memaparkan berbagai langkah dan inovasi untuk mendorong tingkat partisipasi generasi muda di lembaga legislatif, seperti penyediaan kuota kursi bagi legislator muda di parlemen. Dukungan yang semakin kuat dari partai politik bagi kandidat muda juga muncul di banyak negara, serta meningkatnya tren partisipasi generasi muda dalam pemerintahan di tingkat lokal.

Para delegasi juga berbagi pengalaman dan pembelajaran penting tentang pembentukan *Forum of Young Parliamentarians*, serta jaringan parlemen muda hingga saat ini.

Kemudian atas usulan *Board*, para delegasi sepakat bahwa IPU *Global Conference of Young MPs* pada tahun 2022 mendatang harus fokus pada peran pemuda dalam *climate action*. Mereka juga menyepakati rangkaian kegiatan pemberdayaan pemuda, terdiri dari *online briefings*, pelatihan, dan kursus yang akan diselenggarakan oleh IPU pada tahun 2022. Selain itu, para delegasi juga menyerukan agar peningkatan partisipasi pemuda masuk sebagai salah satu area kebijakan tersendiri dalam Strategi IPU 2022-2026.

Menutup rangkaian kegiatan pada forum ini, para anggota parlemen muda sepakat untuk menunjuk Hon. M.A. Rakotomalala (Madagaskar) dan Hon. Patrick Kemper (Paraguay) sebagai *co-rapporteurs* pada forum mendatang, dengan mandat khusus untuk menyusun *Youth Overview Report* sebagai

kontribusi dari sudut pandang parlemen muda terkait *draft resolution* “*Leveraging Information and Communication Technology as an Enabler for the Education Sector, Including in Times of Pandemic,*” yang akan dipertimbangkan pada Sidang IPU ke-144 di Bali, Indonesia pada Maret 2022.

9. Standing Committee on Sustainable Development

Standing Committee on Sustainable Development ini mengangkat tema *Leveraging Information and Communication Technology (ICT) as an Enabler for the Education Sector, Including in Times of Pandemic*. Komisi ini bersidang sebanyak dua kali, yakni pada 27 dan 29 November 2021. Delegasi BKSAP DPR RI yang turut hadir dalam sidang pertama, antara lain Wakil Ketua BKSAP **Achmad Hafisz Tohir** dan **Putu Supadma Rudana**, serta Anggota BKSAP **Didi Irawadi**.

Sesi sidang dipimpin oleh **Hon. Waven William (Seychelles)**, yang merupakan anggota *Bureau of SC Sustainable Development*. Setelah Hon. William membuka sesi, **Ms. Iaroslava Kharkova** dari *UNESCO Future of Learning and Innovation* memperkenalkan tema dan memaparkan isu-isu utama yang akan didiskusikan dalam sidang. Dilanjutkan dengan pemaparan oleh **Hon. Heli Järvinen (Finlandia)** dan **Hon. Dr. Sasmit Patra (India)** selaku *Co-Rapporteurs*, yang menjelaskan gagasan dan usulan mereka terkait substansi

draft resolution yang akan diajukan. Selain itu, IPU juga secara resmi meluncurkan buku panduan terkait *Budgeting for the SDGs: Making the Most of Public Resources*.

Pada kesempatan agenda debat terkait *draft resolution* yang akan disampaikan pada IPU ke-144 mendatang, Wakil Ketua BKSAP **Achmad Hafisz Tohir** menyampaikan intervensi mengenai pandangan Indonesia terkait upaya peningkatan teknologi informasi dan komunikasi (TIK) sebagai *enabler* bagi sektor pendidikan, khususnya di masa pandemi. Pada intervensinya, Wakil Ketua BKSAP menggarisbawahi ketimpangan global dalam akses terhadap teknologi informasi, yakni sebanyak 3.7 miliar penduduk dunia belum memiliki akses internet, serta 463 juta anak di seluruh dunia tidak memperoleh akses pembelajaran jarak jauh yang layak pada masa pandemi. Selain itu, Hafisz juga memaparkan kondisi di Indonesia, bahwa sekitar 60 juta anak kehilangan akses terhadap pendidikan, sementara lebih dari setengah juta sekolah dan perguruan tinggi mengalihkan kegiatan belajar-mengajarnya secara daring. Oleh karena itu, menurutnya kesempatan pemerataan akses pendidikan melalui dukungan TIK harus diperluas.

Menindaklanjuti argumen tersebut, Hafisz kemudian menyerukan pada anggota parlemen untuk memperhatikan, mewaspadai, dan segera mengambil kebijakan untuk menyelesaikan dua tantangan utama dalam penggunaan TIK, yakni ketimpangan digital dan keamanan digital. Terkait keamanan digital, Hafisz memaparkan bahaya penyalahgunaan TIK dalam kejahatan siber, eksploitasi seksual anak, serta pelanggaran hak asasi manusia yang dapat memberi dampak jangka panjang bagi siswa dan generasi muda pengguna internet. Sementara menyoroti ketimpangan antara negara maju dan berkembang serta kondisi di wilayah pedesaan dan perkotaan, ia menekankan pentingnya pembangunan infrastruktur TIK yang setara. Ia kemudian mengapresiasi salah satu proyek yang diinisiasi oleh UNICEF dan ITU (*International Telecommunication Union*), yakni *Giga Project*, untuk meningkatkan konektivitas generasi muda dan pelajar dalam pendidikan melalui akselerasi TIK. Ia juga menjelaskan bahwa Indonesia telah memberi mandat bagi pemerintah daerah untuk mengalokasikan paling sedikit 20% dari anggaran tahunannya bagi sektor pendidikan, dan menekankan pentingnya penajaman alokasi tersebut dalam meningkatkan pemanfaatan TIK di sekolah. Intervensi ini diakhiri dengan seruan bagi seluruh anggota parlemen untuk meningkatkan fungsi pengawasan mereka, dan meningkatkan kerja sama multilateral yang lebih strategis dalam memanfaatkan sisi positif sekaligus menanggulangi efek negatif TIK dalam

pendidikan.

Sebanyak 30 negara menyampaikan intervensinya dalam sesi debat tersebut, yang secara umum mendukung pentingnya TIK sebagai *enabler* dalam sektor pendidikan pada masa pandemi; serta seruan bersama atas pentingnya memanfaatkan potensi kerja sama antar pemangku kepentingan terkait, dan penggunaan berbagai media dalam pembelajaran jarak jauh yang tidak terbatas melalui internet—melainkan juga televisi, radio, dan media alternatif lain yang digunakan oleh penduduk lokal. Sesi debat ini kemudian ditutup oleh Hon. Järvinen, yang menekankan kembali pentingnya dukungan ekonomi untuk meningkatkan TIK dalam pendidikan, serta pentingnya kesadaran bersama bahwa digitalisasi harus dapat diakses oleh semua orang untuk mencegah kesenjangan sosial dan ekonomi. Seluruh masukan yang diberikan delegasi pada debat ini akan terefleksi dalam *draft resolution* yang saat ini tengah disusun oleh *co-rapporteurs*.

Selain sesi debat terhadap tema *draft resolution* tersebut, SC *Sustainable Development* juga menggelar diskusi pada sidang kedua (29/11) terkait tema *Impact of Climate Change on Natural Resources: How Can Parliaments Ensure Inclusive Water Access and Availability*. Diskusi tersebut bertujuan untuk mengidentifikasi aksi-aksi utama yang dapat dilakukan oleh parlemen dalam merespons dampak perubahan iklim, khususnya dalam memastikan ketersediaan akses terhadap air bersih bagi masyarakat. Beberapa pakar menyampaikan argumen dan paparannya dalam diskusi tersebut, antara lain Mr. Dean Muruven dari *Global Policy on Freshwater WWF*, serta Mr. Lifeng Li dari *Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)*.

Sebanyak 25 negara menyampaikan intervensi dalam sesi diskusi tersebut, menjelaskan tantangan dan prioritas dalam pengelolaan sumber daya alam di negara mereka masing-masing. Secara umum, delegasi mengungkapkan pentingnya kerja sama transnasional dalam pengelolaan sumber daya alam, serta menyerukan kerja sama dan aksi kolektif para anggota parlemen untuk memastikan dana pembangunan benar-benar berdampak bagi rakyat dan kelompok masyarakat yang paling rentan.

Agenda lain dalam SC *Sustainable Development* ialah pemilihan Presiden dan Wakil Presiden Komisi untuk periode November 2021 hingga Oktober 2023. Terpilih sebagai Presiden ialah Hon. Agnes Mulder (Belanda), serta Hon. Waven William (Seychelles) sebagai Wakil Presiden. Komisi juga menunjuk kembali beberapa perwakilan wilayah yang akan mewakili Kawasan Arab, Eurasia, dan

Asia-Pasifik dalam *Bureau on Sustainable Development*. Selain itu, *Bureau* juga mengusulkan bahwa pertemuan-pertemuan Komisi tiap tahunnya dapat difokuskan untuk membahas tujuan-tujuan spesifik dalam SDGs, melalui pemetaan aktivitas dari masing-masing parlemen terkait status implementasi, sekaligus sebagai platform untuk berbagi praktik-praktik terbaik.

Menutup rangkaian sidang SC *Sustainable Development*, Komisi menyetujui proposal *Bureau* untuk mendedikasikan sesi sidang pada IPU ke-144 di Bali mendatang untuk menyusun dan menyepakati resolusi terkait *Leveraging ICT as an Enabler for the Education Sector, Including in Times of Pandemic* yang telah dibahas pada sesi ini.

10. Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights

Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights membahas tema utama “*Legislation worldwide to combat online child sexual exploitation and abuse*”.

Pada kesempatan agenda Debate on the draft resolution, Wakil Ketua BKSAP DPR RI, **Dr. Mardani Ali Sera**, menyampaikan intervensi mengenai pandangan Indonesia atas rancangan resolusi berjudul “*Legislation worldwide to combat online child sexual exploitation and abuse*”. Wakil Ketua BKSAP menyerukan kepada anggota parlemen untuk mereformasi kerangka hukum nasional untuk mengatasi kejahatan eksploitasi seksual dan kekerasan terhadap anak. Merupakan tanggung jawab bersama untuk memastikan penegakan hukum tersebut secara efektif, dan mengadaptasi langkah-langkah di tingkat global agar sesuai dengan konteks nasional tanpa mengabaikan standar internasional.

Pasal 19 Konvensi PBB tentang Hak Anak (*UN Convention on the Rights of Child*) tidak hanya menekankan perlunya mengambil langkah-langkah legislatif untuk mencegah dan memerangi segala bentuk kekerasan terhadap anak, tetapi juga pentingnya mengevaluasi upaya tersebut secara berkala. Oleh karena itu, penting bagi anggota parlemen untuk tetap mengikuti perkembangan dengan meninjau dan memperbarui standar kerangka hukum, mengidentifikasi kelemahan, dan bidang perbaikan dalam undang-undang yang ada untuk terus melindungi generasi masa depan. Pendekatan multifaset diperlukan untuk memerangi kekerasan seksual terhadap anak secara efektif.

Karena sifatnya yang transnasional, kejahatan online ini hanya dapat diselesaikan dengan memajukan upaya bersama antar-parlemen. Selain memastikan bahwa pemangku kepentingan nasional sepenuhnya menyadari kejahatan eksploitasi seksual dan kekerasan terhadap anak terus berkembang. Penting untuk menjalin kerja sama strategis secara global. Hal ini untuk

menegaskan kembali komitmen kolektif dengan tingkat ambisi yang sama dalam implementasi UNCRC dan Resolusi yang akan diadopsi Sidang ke-143 IPU.

Indonesia berperan aktif dalam pembahasan amandemen resolusi. Berbagai usulan diajukan untuk memperkuat rancangan resolusi yang akan diadopsi oleh Sidang ke 143 IPU. Resolusi *“Legislation worldwide to combat online child sexual exploitation and abuse”* bertujuan untuk mendorong parlemen untuk mengambil tindakan yang diperlukan dalam mereformasi kerangka hukum nasional terkait kekerasan seksual terhadap anak, termasuk secara online yang menyesuaikan dengan standar internasional yang berlaku dewasa ini.

Substansi di dalam resolusi menekankan pentingnya ketersediaan, aksesibilitas, dan keterjangkauan layanan dan undang-undang Parlemen nasional. IPU juga diharapkan untuk meningkatkan kesadaran publik tentang masalah ini dan terus mendukung upaya negara-negara dalam memerangi eksploitasi anak secara online. Selain itu, resolusi menyerukan untuk meningkatkan kerja sama antar-negara, perusahaan teknologi dan penegak hukum, juga menekankan bahwa semua tindakan teknis yang tersedia dan dalam undang-undang privasi, harus digunakan untuk mencegah penyebaran materi ini dan menghambat pelaku untuk melakukan pelanggaran.

Rancangan resolusi juga mendorong parlemen, IPU, dan mitra terkait lainnya untuk berkolaborasi dalam memastikan bahwa resolusi ini akan diterjemahkan ke dalam tindakan nasional yang spesifik, memantau kemajuan, dan membangun kapasitas parlemen dan anggota parlemen untuk mengembangkan dan memantau kebijakan nasional yang memerangi eksploitasi dan pelecehan seksual anak secara online.

Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights membahas juga program kerja dan resolusi untuk *IPU Assembly* berikutnya.

Terkait usulan resolusi, *Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights* menyepakati topik *“Parliamentary impetus to local and regional development of countries with high levels of international migration and to stopping all forms, including state sponsored, of human trafficking and human rights abuses”* sebagai tema resolusi yang akan dibahas di Sidang ke 145 IPU di Rwanda.

Komisi Democracy and Human Rights menyepakati juga topik untuk panel debat mengenai *“the role of parliaments in reconciling health measures during a pandemic with the preservation of civil liberties”* sebagai tema debat di Sidang ke-144 IPU di Indonesia.

D. SIDE-MEETING

1. Parliamentary Network of the Non-Aligned Movement (PN-NAM)

Dr. (H.C.) Puan Maharani menghadiri pertemuan inaugurasi *the Parliamentary Network of Non-Aligned Movement (NAM)* yang merupakan bagian dari rangkaian pertemuan *143rd Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) General Assembly* di Madrid, Spanyol. Pertemuan PN-NAM kali ini diinisiasi oleh Azerbaijan yang memegang kepemimpinan NAM periode kali ini. Tujuan dari pertemuan ini bertujuan untuk membangun jaringan kerja sama antar anggota parlemen, yang diharapkan meningkatkan keterwakilan masyarakat dalam pengambilan keputusan.

Ketua DPR RI menyampaikan pidatonya yang menekankan pada semangat dan nilai-nilai yang dipegang sebagai dasar pembentukan organisasi tersebut 61 tahun yang lalu. Lebih lanjut Ketua DPR RI menyatakan bahwa organisasi yang didirikan pada *Bandung Conference* tahun 1955 tersebut, masih relevan dengan dinamika global dewasa ini.

Ketua DPR RI juga menekankan bahwa parlemen sebagai perwakilan masyarakat sudah seharusnya memainkan peran yang lebih besar terkait pengambilan keputusan global, dan PN-NAM dapat menjadi wahana kerja sama tersebut dalam mengartikulasikan komitmen global kepada masyarakat luas.

Pertemuan ini mengadopsi Madrid Delegation. Deklarasi ini menggarisbawahi situasi global terkait isu-isu perdamaian, keamanan, dan pembangunan berkelanjutan. Deklarasi ini juga menegaskan kembali komitmen NAM terhadap prinsip dan tujuan yang dihasilkan di Bandung (1955) dan Belgrade (1966). Selain itu, deklarasi ini juga mengakui bahwa semakin samarnya batas antar negara, turut meningkatkan tantangan yang dihadapi oleh dunia modern yang membutuhkan kerja sama dan koordinasi yang lebih erat dari seluruh anggota NAM dalam menanggapinya.

2. *Workshop on interfaith dialogue*

Pada Sidang ke-143 kali ini, IPU menyelenggarakan dua sesi *workshop* dengan tema khusus, salah satunya terkait *Good Parliamentary Practices to Promote Interfaith Dialogue* pada 28 November 2021. *Workshop* ini diadakan berdasarkan hasil Sidang IPU ke-137 tahun 2017 di St. Petersburg, yang bertujuan untuk menyatukan para anggota parlemen, pakar, dan praktisi dalam konteks pluralisme agama, geografis, dan budaya yang berbeda untuk berbagi pengalaman dan gagasan tentang peran parlemen dalam mempromosikan perdamaian antar masyarakat dengan perbedaan keyakinan. Pada *workshop* ini, Wakil Ketua BKSAP DPR RI, **Putu Supadma Rudana** menjadi salah satu pembicara panel.

Workshop ini dipimpin oleh **Dr. Alba Sabaté Gauxachs**, *Deputy Director of Blanquerna Observatory on Media, Religion and Culture, Ramon Llull University Barcelona* selaku moderator diskusi. Selain Bpk. Putu S. Rudana, panelis lain dalam *workshop* ini merepresentasikan latar belakang budaya dan agama yang beragam, antara lain:

- **Hon. Konstantin Kosachev** (*Deputy Speaker, Council of the Russian Federation*);
- **Hon. Meera Sultan Naser Al Suwaidi** (*MP, The United Arab Emirates*);
- **Amb. Daniele Verga** (*Diplomatic Counsellor, Sovereign Order of Malta*); dan
- **Mr. Mokhtar Omar** (*Senior Advisor to the IPU Secretary General*).

Mengawali paparannya, Putu S. Rudana memperkenalkan Bali—yang tidak hanya tersohor karena keindahannya sebagai destinasi wisata global, tetapi juga terkenal akan seni, budaya, agama Hindu, serta tingkat toleransi yang tinggi antar warganya, hingga menjadikan Bali sebagai provinsi tertinggi dalam indeks kerukunan umat beragama. Beliau kemudian menjelaskan beberapa konsep dan prinsip dasar masyarakat Bali yang mendukung toleransi dan menjadi landasan utama dalam kehidupan bermasyarakat, antara lain *Tat Twam Asi* dan *Tri Hita Karana*. Penerapan nilai-nilai dasar tersebut juga tercermin dalam beberapa contoh yang dipaparkan oleh Bpk. Putu, antara lain perayaan Nyepi dan tradisi pengelolaan irigasi melalui sistem Subak.

Putu S. Rudana kemudian memaparkan bahwa Indonesia patut menjadi contoh negara multikultur yang dapat hidup harmonis, dengan populasi lebih dari 270 juta penduduk yang tersebar di seluruh kepulauan nusantara, dengan beragam agama, suku bangsa, serta lebih dari 1.000 kelompok etnis dan budaya lokal. Menggarisbawahi peran aktif parlemen dalam mendorong harmoni dan toleransi berbangsa, ia memaparkan bahwa pada tahun 2012 DPR RI mengesahkan UU No. 7/2012 tentang Penanganan Konflik Sosial, yang menjadi payung hukum utama dalam menangani konflik horizontal berbasis agama. Selain itu, saat ini tengah disusun pula RUU tentang Kerukunan Umat Beragama, yang juga menggarisbawahi perlindungan terhadap penganut agama minoritas dari berbagai bentuk kekerasan, serta pencegahan intoleransi agama. DPR RI juga berperan penting dalam mengawasi berbagai program pemerintah di bidang ini, salah satunya ialah Forum Kerukunan Umat Beragama (FKUB).

Selain itu, dalam ranah kerja sama antar parlemen, DPR RI juga aktif mempromosikan *interfaith dialogue* dan kerukunan antar umat beragama, antara lain melalui kerja sama bilateral terkait isu toleransi dan *interfaith* yang telah terjalin dengan 32 negara sejak tahun 2004. Pada level multilateral, DPR RI juga berperan aktif sebagai tuan rumah *United Nations Alliance of Civilization (UNAC) Forum 2014*, yang menghasilkan *Bali Declaration* sebagai komitmen internasional dalam mempromosikan toleransi dan memerangi diskriminasi. Mengakhiri paparannya, Putu menyerukan pada anggota parlemen yang hadir untuk memperkuat nilai-nilai lokal dan nasional yang mendukung toleransi, pentingnya membangun *mutual trust* dan kesepahaman dalam masyarakat, serta memperkuat kerja sama. Ia berharap bahwa pengalaman Indonesia ini dapat menegaskan bahwa agama dan demokrasi dapat hidup berdampingan, serta memberikan kontribusi yang konstruktif bagi kehidupan masyarakat dunia yang damai dan sejahtera.

Paparan dari Wakil Ketua BKSAP tersebut memperoleh sambutan yang positif dari peserta *workshop*. Menanggapi pertanyaan dari moderator terkait langkah-langkah yang perlu dilakukan untuk memperkuat supremasi hukum dan kenegaraan dalam menciptakan masyarakat plural yang kuat dan damai, Putu memaparkan tiga poin utama berdasarkan sudut pandang Indonesia, yakni: i) Pentingnya mempromosikan dialog aktif antar komunitas dengan latar belakang yang berbeda di masyarakat; ii) Mempertahankan nilai, prinsip dan kearifan lokal sebagai landasan harmoni berbangsa; serta iii) Konservasi alam untuk menjaga keseimbangan harmoni dan kebermanfaatan bagi generasi yang akan datang. Ia juga memaparkan Konstitusi UUD 1945 dan Pancasila sebagai dasar negara yang menjamin kesetaraan hak seluruh warga negara untuk menganut kepercayaannya masing-masing, serta semboyan *Bhinneka Tunggal Ika*.

Para panelis dan peserta *workshop* juga menggarisbawahi peran penting parlemen di bidang ini, terutama dalam mengesahkan legislasi dan payung hukum yang menjamin kebebasan beragama dan berkeyakinan, pemajuan dan perlindungan hak yang setara bagi seluruh komunitas agama, memastikan langkah-langkah pencegahan terhadap ujaran kebencian, serta mempromosikan budaya toleransi dan saling menghormati. Panelis dan peserta juga berbagi praktik-praktik yang sedang dilaksanakan oleh negara masing-masing, baik di tingkat nasional maupun daerah, serta berbagai tantangan yang dihadapi.

Berdasarkan beragam perspektif yang dipaparkan dalam *workshop* ini, para

peserta mengakui, di satu sisi, bahwa kehidupan berdampingan (*coexistence*) yang damai antar berbagai komunitas agama dapat tercapai; di sisi lain, bahwa peran parlemen sangat krusial dalam memastikan legislasi yang melindungi kelompok minoritas dan memerangi diskriminasi, serta pentingnya mendorong dialog dan kerja sama antar aktor agama dan politik untuk mencapai kondisi tersebut.

Topik penting lain yang juga dibahas dalam sesi diskusi dan tanya-jawab *workshop* ini ialah pentingnya fokus pada hubungan intra-kepercayaan, khususnya intra-Muslim, dengan wilayah Timur Tengah dan Sahel sebagai contoh utama (diwakili oleh diskusi antara delegasi dari Iran dan salah satu panelis, Mr. Mokhtar Omar). Isu lain yang juga disoroti, ialah pentingnya melindungi warga negara dari penyalahgunaan konsep-konsep keagamaan yang dapat menjadi ancaman bagi masyarakat. Kurangnya pendidikan juga dipandang sebagai ancaman utama bagi masyarakat yang damai dan harmonis. Hubungan antara kebebasan beragama dan kebebasan berpendapat juga dibahas dalam diskusi, di mana keduanya merupakan hak asasi manusia yang harus dijunjung tinggi.

Menutup sesi *workshop* ini, moderator merangkum lima kesepakatan utama:

- Pentingnya tema *workshop* ini sebagai isu utama bagi parlemen;
- Pentingnya legislasi untuk memerangi diskriminasi dan kebencian, melindungi minoritas, melindungi kebebasan berkeyakinan, serta kebebasan berpendapat;
- Peningkatan kerja sama antar aktor agama & politik, khususnya anggota parlemen;
- Perlunya parlemen melibatkan pemuka agama untuk mempromosikan nilai-nilai *coexistence*, toleransi dan persaudaraan; serta
- Perlunya anggota parlemen untuk menegakkan nilai-nilai kewarganegaraan dan mempromosikan pendidikan tentang kewarganegaraan.

3. *Global Organization of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC) Statement at the 143rd Assembly*

General Debate pada *IPU Assembly* ke-143 kali ini berlangsung selama tiga hari, dimulai sejak 27 November hingga 29 November 2021 dengan topik “*Contemporary Challenges to Democracy: Overcoming Division and Building Community.*” Sebanyak 110 anggota parlemen dari 92 negara dan 6 organisasi *observer* turut berkontribusi. Ketua BKSAP DPR RI, **Dr. Fadli Zon**, sekaligus

Wakil Ketua *Global Organization of Parliamentarians against Corruption* (GOPAC)—organisasi global yang merupakan *permanent observer IPU*, juga berkesempatan untuk menyampaikan pidato dalam *general debate* pada 29 November 2021.



Ketua BKSAP DPR RI sekaligus Wakil Ketua GOPAC, Bpk. Dr. Fadli Zon, menyampaikan pidato pada General Debate, Sidang IPU ke-143.

Mengawali pidatonya, Ketua BKSAP menyatakan polarisasi sebagai salah satu tantangan terhadap demokrasi yang paling destruktif saat ini. Oleh karena itu, proses merancang solusi dan menetapkan langkah-langkah perbaikan untuk menanggulangi tantangan tersebut membutuhkan pemahaman yang mendalam terkait akar masalah. Beberapa penyebab polarisasi yang dapat teridentifikasi ialah semakin melebarnya kesenjangan sosial-ekonomi, serta disinformasi dalam diskursus politik dan ruang publik. Fadli Zon kemudian menyoroti satu akar masalah yang menurutnya paling krusial: korupsi yang merajalela dan mengakar.

Pada tahun 2012, panduan legislatif untuk implementasi Konvensi Anti-Korupsi PBB (UNCAC) menyebutkan berbagai efek jangka panjang korupsi, termasuk polarisasi dan kesenjangan. Kerugian dunia akibat korupsi tiap tahunnya ialah sebanyak \$2,6 triliun (5% PDB global), yang tidak hanya berakibat pada pertumbuhan ekonomi, tetapi juga kohesi sosial. Korupsi memicu timbulnya ketidakpuasan, meningkatnya rasa ketidakadilan, dan mengikis kepercayaan

publik terhadap proses demokrasi. Struktur klientelistik dalam pemerintahan yang korup akan semakin memperparah ketimpangan ekonomi dan memecah belah masyarakat. Pembangunan yang tidak merata akibat korupsi juga memperparah kondisi masyarakat yang paling rentan.

Ketua BKSAP menyatakan dalam pidatonya bahwa memerangi korupsi berarti menyembuhkan perpecahan. Memastikan tata kelola yang transparan dan akuntabel, melambungkan komitmen dalam membangun masyarakat yang lebih baik. Ia menyerukan bahwa parlemen berperan penting dalam proses tersebut. Dalam hal ini, GOPAC adalah sebuah jaringan bagi anggota parlemen untuk bekerja sama, berkolaborasi dan melakukan advokasi dalam bidang anti-korupsi, serta mempromosikan tata pemerintahan yang baik di tingkat global.

Salah satu fokus GOPAC adalah mempromosikan kerangka keterbukaan parlemen, yang sangat penting untuk menjamin transparansi dan menangkal efek disinformasi melalui akuntabilitas. Bpk. Fadli kemudian menyerukan kepada para anggota parlemen untuk mengadopsi produk legislasi yang menjamin hak atas informasi publik, dan mendorong keterbukaan informasi parlemen secara proaktif—misalnya melalui pembangunan inisiatif *Open Parliament* di lembaga legislatif negara masing-masing. Selain itu, melalui *Global Task Force on Participation of Society*, GOPAC mendorong proses pengambilan keputusan yang inklusif dan partisipatif. Fadli juga menyatakan pentingnya melakukan tinjauan dan kajian yang lebih komprehensif tentang dampak yang akan dialami oleh minoritas dan kelompok yang paling rentan dalam proses perumusan legislasi dan pengambilan kebijakan.

Untuk dapat mengatasi tantangan demokrasi, upaya anti-korupsi oleh parlemen harus mempertimbangkan strategi yang holistik dan multifaset; yakni tidak hanya mengesahkan dan menegakkan undang-undang anti-korupsi, tetapi juga memperkuat akuntabilitas politik, meningkatkan partisipasi, dan memperjuangkan inisiatif keterbukaan. Terkait tujuan tersebut, Fadli menyatakan bahwa GOPAC siap untuk memfasilitasi pertukaran informasi, menyediakan panduan dan kerja sama peningkatan kapasitas bagi parlemen, serta terlibat dalam proses pembelajaran resiprokal lintas kawasan (melalui 5 cabang regional di Afrika, Asia Tenggara, Arab, Amerika Latin, dan Oseania; serta cabang nasional di 64 negara).

Mengakhiri pidatonya, Fadli mengajak seluruh anggota IPU untuk meningkatkan kerja sama dan secara kolektif memperkuat komitmen dalam memerangi korupsi, guna mencegah kemunduran demokrasi.

E. PERTEMUAN BILATERAL

British Group on IPU (BG IPU)

Pertemuan Bilateral dengan *British Group on IPU (BG IPU)* dilaksanakan pada tanggal 28 November 2021. Delegasi BG IPU dipimpin **Hon. Wayne David** (Labour Party) dan beranggotakan **Baroness Hooper CMG** (*Conservative*), **Baroness Sheehan** (*Liberal Democrat*) dan perwakilan anggota parlemen muda, **Hon. Taiwo Owatemi** (*Labour Party*).

Delegasi DPR RI dipimpin Ketua BKSAP, **Dr. Fadli Zon** dan beranggotakan Wakil Ketua BKSAP, **Putu Supadma Rudana, MBA.**

Dalam pertemuan tersebut dibahas berbagai isu bilateral di antaranya mengenai komitmen perubahan iklim di bawah ***Paris Agreement*** dan deforestasi. Untuk isu deforestasi, Ketua BKSAP DPR RI menyampaikan beberapa upaya yang dilakukan di tingkat nasional termasuk di dalamnya perbaikan manajemen tata kelola hutan, dan moratorium konsesi perusahaan hutan. Tidak dipungkiri saat ini masih ada berbagai tantangan yang bermuara dari praktek oligarki yang telah berlangsung dalam waktu lama. DPR RI juga tengah berupaya menyelesaikan pembahasan RUU Energi Baru Terbarukan di Komisi VII sebagai upaya mendorong komitmen nasional untuk pertumbuhan hijau.

Wakil Ketua BKSAP menyampaikan mengenai pembangunan di Bali yang mengadopsi kearifan lokal yang sejalan dengan SDGs, yaitu *Tri Hita Karana*. *Assembly ke-144 IPU* nanti akan menjadi *showcase* komitmen Indonesia untuk pembangunan berkelanjutan, dan agenda ekonomi hijau. Pertemuan ditutup dengan BG IPU menyampaikan keinginan untuk hadir di *Assembly ke-144 IPU*.

F. UPACARA PENUTUPAN

Dr. (H.C.) Puan Maharani, Ketua DPR RI menghadiri upacara penutupan persidangan *Inter-Parliamentary Union* pada tanggal 30 November 2021. Pada kesempatan ini Ketua DPR RI mengundang seluruh delegasi yang hadir di Madrid, untuk hadir di *the 144th Inter-Parliamentary Union General Assembly* yang akan diselenggarakan pada 20 – 24 Maret 2022 di Nusa Dua, Bali.

The 144th Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) General Assembly merupakan sidang kedua yang diselenggarakan ketika pandemi, dan Bali siap untuk menjadi tuan rumah pertemuan tersebut. Parlemen Indonesia juga menegaskan kembali komitmennya kepada kerja sama multilateral yang diwadahi pada pertemuan tersebut. Contemporary challenges to democracy: Overcoming division and building community

*Endorsed by the 143rd IPU Assembly
(Madrid, 30 November 2021)*

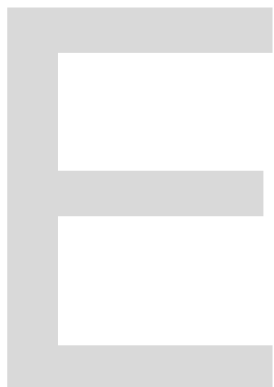
As members of parliaments and representatives of the people, we have an overriding responsibility to serve our communities through a system of democratic governance where every voice counts. The world is striving to overcome a wide array of challenges created by social, political, economic and health-related upheavals. Societal divides and the deterioration of social peace are having an impact on the state of democracy, and in particular on the institutions that put democratic values into practice.

In the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the world's governments committed to promoting peaceful and inclusive societies, providing access to justice for all and building effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels. As parliaments, we share the commitment to achieving those objectives.

In doing so, we will strengthen democracy at the national and global levels. We are convinced that overcoming social divisions, uniting instead of dividing, fostering hope not hate, joining forces and seeking common ground are vital to addressing the contemporary challenges to democracy.

These challenges are numerous. A growing perception that the political establishment is losing touch with the population has fuelled the rise of populism and deepened societal divides. Decreasing trust in political systems, rising economic gaps, structural inequalities, growing disengagement and increasing polarization are being experienced around the world. Young people under 30 make up about half of the world's population but are disproportionately absent from the decision-making process. As today's young people become tomorrow's adults, failure to engage with them meaningfully will further undermine the cohesion of our societies.

Technological advancements such as social media have made incredible contributions to public access to information and new forms of exchange. However, the same tools have also facilitated the flow of disinformation, spreading anger and frustration and impacting the very fabric of society. In the context of the global pandemic, they have in some instances been used to undermine scientific evidence and national vaccination campaigns, with a negative impact on public health. They are all too easily harnessed as tools to intentionally sow mistrust and spread hate. Sexist hate speech and online harassment affect women in particular, as a means of questioning their legitimacy and their right to take part in the democratic process.

Polarization and populism are not new concepts, but the current context provides the conditions for them to flourish. The level of polarization has reached new heights. Partisan competition is normal and healthy, but intense polarization carries significant risks. It penetrates society as a whole, affecting everyday interactions. It has the potential to damage the culture of tolerance, increase conflict and widen distrust. It can also severely undermine the effectiveness of our democratic institutions.

The COVID-19 pandemic has further aggravated existing challenges, affecting democratic processes, leading to questioning of evidence-based decision-making, and ultimately challenging the ability of the democratic model to cope with and recover from emergencies.

Towards new approaches to politics

Politics that is founded on confrontation and division undermines the legitimacy of the system as a whole. We are concerned that increased polarization reduces the opportunities to build broad coalitions in society and implement bold public policies to address urgent issues such as climate change.

Addressing the contemporary challenges to democracy requires a concerted effort by us all. Political leadership and solidarity are vital as we seek new approaches to politics. Our response must be based on a renewed commitment to our core democratic values, inclusiveness and problem-solving through dialogue and an evidence-based approach.

Countering disinformation and hate speech

Legislative and policy measures are needed in order to strengthen democratic resilience and create a vibrant information ecosystem, which contributes to democracy, the rule of law and respect for fundamental rights. In our parliaments, we must be vigilant to threats to civic space and resolute in our defence of freedom of expression and the diversity of views, while at the same time countering disinformation and combatting online harm.

Democracies need informed citizens with a solid understanding of how democracy works and the skills to participate in it. Just as we vaccinate our citizens against the COVID-19 pandemic, we need to build immunity against disinformation and attempts to manipulate public opinion. We need to invest in media literacy and civic education at all ages and for all sectors of society, in order to ensure that our populations are well-informed and equipped with critical thinking skills.

We recognize the important role of the media and journalists as sources of information and an essential part of free and open societies. Underlying economic shifts threaten the sustainability of independent journalism at local and national levels. We must explore new models that protect the diversity of views and critical perspectives in the media.

Both traditional media and social media outlets bear responsibility for ensuring differing views can be expressed without fear of reprisals or harassment. Respect for diversity must be fostered by those who inform and facilitate public debate. As parliamentarians, we must create the conditions for free speech while protecting those who take part in public debate from any form of violence, sexism and harassment, including online.

We are cognizant of the key role of the private sector in driving innovation and technological change. At the same time, we cannot stand by while power accumulates in the hands of a small number of online platforms. We must engage in a constructive multi-stakeholder dialogue and find appropriate regulatory responses. The underlying business model of social media platforms is based on engagement and popularity, and tends to reward polemic and emotion. An open and inclusive dialogue could accelerate the reassessment of the current approach in favour of a more human-centred model, which furthermore would protect private data.

Reducing polarization

The underlying factors of polarization, such as growing economic gaps and inequalities, the exclusion of some societal groups from political discourse and the disruption of the media industry through technological advancement, can only be overcome if there is a strong political will.

A core function of the parliamentary ecosystem is to promote trust in democracy and reinforce the relevance of representative institutions. Effective political systems and parliamentarians promote a culture of cooperation and dialogue to surmount divisions, build inclusive societies and promote trust.

Political leaders and elected officials bear responsibility for demonstrating respect for democratic values in their words and actions. Wider societal coherence can be built by avoiding poisonous rhetoric, demonstrating a willingness to cooperate across party lines and promoting evidence-based decision-making. Parliamentarians, both men and women, must play their part in countering polarization by creating spaces in parliament for cross-party dialogue. Women's caucuses often set a positive example of how party divides can be bridged and how legislative work can be less hostile and more evidence-based. There is a need for similar approaches throughout parliaments.

Political parties must also play their part in winning back public trust in democratic systems and building strong institutions, by being more socially representative and responsive, and delivering on their electoral promises.

We reaffirm that political compromise is a core of the democratic process and believe that the ability to reach agreements, cooperate across political divides and prioritize public interests over party politics contributes to de-polarization and sustainable social peace.

Parliaments must create the conditions for all voices to be heard within the institution, including all political views, whether majority or opposition. Internal policies must ensure balanced participation, bearing in mind diversity – whether based on political affiliation, gender, age or otherwise – as well as zero tolerance towards disrespectful, discriminatory and sexist speech or behaviour within parliament.

Parliaments must support or lead efforts to promote the use of evidence in policy making, for example by reinforcing national statistical capacities, encouraging independent sources of research and analysis, and developing methodologies for public consultation so that the views of the people most directly concerned by legislation and policy can be taken into account. In their own work, parliaments must develop close links with academic institutions in order to improve access to the best available scientific information, for example on climate change. Parliaments must also invest in the capacity of their own parliamentary research services to provide non-partisan research and support to all parliamentarians.

Connecting people with their democratic institutions

For democratic systems to work, people must have the opportunities and the will to participate in them. Maintaining trust in parliamentary democracy requires regular interaction between governing bodies and the public. We must foster meaningful public engagement in the work of parliament that builds confidence and helps people see their interests reflected in policy. We are convinced of the need to embed a culture of engagement across our parliaments for a united and concerted effort towards broader and deeper public participation.

Public engagement also contributes to inclusive decision-making. We must work towards a more inclusive form of politics, making strong connections between parliaments and a diverse range of communities, with a particular focus on the most vulnerable and marginalized populations. Parliaments have a responsibility to be more representative, including of women, youth, indigenous peoples, minorities and other underrepresented groups in society. Greater intergenerational collaboration not only builds solidarity among political actors of all ages, but also encourages the inclusion of youth perspectives in policy solutions.

Leading in times of crisis

The COVID-19 pandemic is a vivid reminder that crises often arise when least expected. The pandemic has challenged our governance systems and our ability to handle emergencies. We need to learn from that experience and be better prepared for the next crisis.

Parliaments have a critical role to play in enhancing the quality of emergency preparedness and their own ability to manage crises whenever they occur. Parliaments must also ensure that democratic processes are not undermined in such situations.

Crisis management plans must be an integral part of our governance system. Rules and procedures and the roles and responsibilities of political actors need to be clearly set out in legal frameworks or policies. The balance of power must be preserved even during times of crisis. Parliaments need to be able to continue to fulfil their oversight mandate and supervise the actions of the executive at all times.

Above all, responsiveness and inclusiveness must be an integral part of every crisis management strategy. Parliaments need to communicate with people to demonstrate that they are listening to what people have to say and are addressing issues of public concern.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, many parliaments managed to adjust to the new realities and use innovative approaches in their operations. Still, we need to prepare ourselves even more thoroughly. We must further embed the use of digital technologies in parliamentary operations to ensure continuity of work in times of emergency and explore new mechanisms of public participation and ways to connect society and the authorities.

We recognize that the contemporary challenges to democracy have deep roots. We nevertheless accept our role and responsibility as actors in addressing these challenges, conscious of the need to protect democracy for the common good. We acknowledge the need to show effective leadership, to pursue bold and innovative initiatives, and to learn from each other's successes and failures.

As such, we pledge to do our utmost, individually and collectively, to overcome these challenges, build community, and protect and promote our democratic values and institutions.

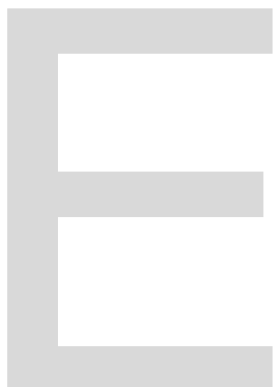
Harnessing global parliamentary support for vaccine equity in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic

Draft resolution submitted by the drafting committee

Rapporteur: Mr. W. William (Seychelles)

The 143rd Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union,

- (1) *Welcoming* the UN Security Council Resolution 2565 (2021) adopted on 26 February 2021,
- (2) *Recalling* that the right to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical, mental and social health and well-being is a fundamental human right enshrined in Article 25 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, Sustainable Development Goal 3, the Constitution of the World Health Organization, the majority of national constitutions and other international treaties and agreements to which IPU Members are signatories,
- (3) *Further recalling* that this right is accorded to all human beings regardless of race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, disability, birth or other status,
- (4) *Cognizant* that, on 23 September 2019, world leaders endorsed a comprehensive political declaration on health at the UN High-Level Meeting on Universal Health Coverage under the theme “*Universal Health Coverage: Moving Together to Build a Healthier World*” in which they undertook to co-operate in strengthening health systems to ensure that they are equitable, resilient and capable of meeting everyone’s needs as an essential priority for international development,
- (5) *Mindful* that, at the 141st IPU Assembly held in Belgrade, Serbia in October 2019, the IPU adopted a landmark resolution entitled *Achieving Universal Health Coverage by 2030: The role of parliaments in ensuring the right to health* calling for parliaments to take all legal and policy measures to achieve Universal Health Coverage and address barriers to access to health for all,
- (6) *Noting* that the COVID-19 pandemic has been an ongoing moment of reckoning for health systems and health security around the world, as well as to our commitment in both word and deed to achieving Universal Health Coverage and addressing barriers to access to health for all in such times of crisis,

(7) *Recognizing* that vaccination is part of a comprehensive strategy to reduce transmission and save lives and is among the most important tools in the fight against the pandemic, and reaffirming that extensive COVID-19 immunization is a global public good,

(8) *Welcoming* the fact that the COVID-19 Vaccines Global Access (COVAX) initiative has already delivered more than 550 million vaccine doses to low and lower-middle income countries, including substantial amounts of vaccine donations from high income countries, and has secured enough vaccines to cover 43 per cent of the populations concerned,

(9) *Concerned* that prolonged delays in the recognition and registration of vaccines complicate the health and developmental crisis, economic downturn and suffering occasioned by the COVID-19 pandemic in Africa and other regions among those most affected, and that vaccine inequality translates into social and economic inequality resulting in more fatalities and increased poverty,

1. *Calls upon* the international community and the WHO to further advance joint efforts to ensure timely, equitable and universal access to safe, affordable, quality and effective vaccines, with particular regard to the needs of low and middle income countries and the most affected regions;
2. *Calls upon* countries to recognize the importance of the principle of equity, meaning that each person must be vaccinated in accordance with their level of risk and needs, and to ensure that that principle be reflected at the national and global levels with respect to access to essential vaccines;
3. *Encourages* vaccine manufacturers to provide regular, clear supply forecasts as to how they will fulfil and prioritize their contracts with COVAX and other relevant regional initiatives;
4. *Encourages* vaccine manufacturers to enhance the production of vaccines by using flexible cooperation models such as building up fill and finish production capacities, technology partnerships and licensing activities;
5. *Calls upon* governments to harmonize all regulatory requirements to accelerate the supply of vaccines, and provide the logistics and training for implementing large-scale vaccination programmes;
6. *Implores* parliamentarians to work with their national governments to exert a global and collective influence on the WTO to eliminate all export restrictions and any other trade barriers on COVID-19 vaccines and the inputs involved in their production;
7. *Insists* on the fact that both national and international efforts to raise awareness regarding the effectiveness of vaccines, to engage communities and to reduce vaccine hesitancy are indispensable to attain a sufficient degree of immunization around the world and that considerably more efforts in this field are required.

New and ongoing peace processes will determine regional and global security for many years to come while, worryingly, a significant percentage of these agreements fail soon after they are signed or are not being implemented at all. Although the nature of conflict has been changing, the approach that has regulated the way conflicts are resolved has not evolved significantly over the last 50 years. The Committee will hold an expert hearing to share opinions on how parliaments can collectively establish a new frame of reference that would serve as a basis for moral and ethical peace processes and set standards of greater accountability and long-term oversight to guide their implementation. During the hearing, the concepts of human security and traditional security will be presented to participants, who will examine ways to establish a valuable framework for building thriving, stable and inclusive societies by identifying the best aspects of each of the concepts mentioned. The co-Rapporteurs will draw on the hearing and the subsequent debate as they write the first draft of a resolution on the topic that will be tabled at the 144th IPU Assembly.

4. **Panel discussion on the theme *Parliament's role in addressing the risks of diversion in arms transfers***

The diversion of conventional arms to unauthorized end users and their subsequent use pose a significant threat to societies around the globe. Diversion undermines the effectiveness of counter-proliferation efforts and frustrates attempts to regulate the international arms trade for purposes consistent with relevant international law and standards. The Committee will hold a panel discussion to examine how parliaments could tackle the challenges associated with poorly regulated arms transfers at the national, regional and multilateral levels, and inform the development of good policies and practices to counter diversion by focusing on ways to prevent and eradicate the illicit trafficking of arms, particularly small arms and light weapons.

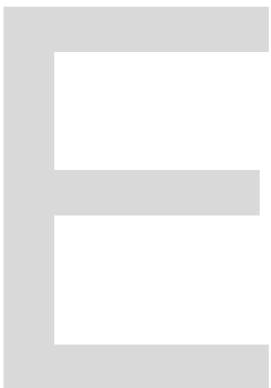

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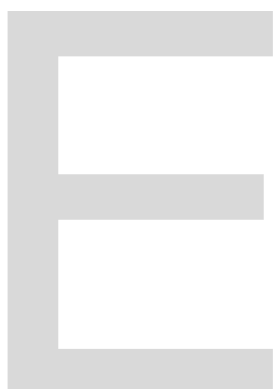

Unequal access to the COVID-19 vaccine worldwide, with most people in developing countries left far behind, provides a clear illustration of a multilateral system in need of reform. Though many people called for the vaccine to be declared a "global public good", that has not happened.

Initiatives created to facilitate the global distribution of vaccines and the sharing of vaccine-making technologies have fallen far short of the mark. The strongly-held intellectual property rights of vaccine-making pharmaceutical companies have made it difficult for developing countries to produce the large quantities needed to meet current demand for billions of doses, and to do so at low cost.

This session will feature a discussion with WHO and WTO representatives on their agencies' role in the global vaccination campaign.

4. **The UN Secretary-General's Report on Our Common Agenda**

The Declaration adopted at the September 2020 High-Level Meeting on the occasion of the UN 75th Anniversary (UN75 Summit) included twelve commitments to tackle urgent global challenges within a stronger multilateral framework. Named "Our Common Agenda", these commitments aim to reset global efforts towards a more sustainable, just and peaceful world with the United Nations leading the way.

Following consultations with parliaments and other stakeholders, in September 2021 the UN Secretary-General issued a major report with recommendations on how to implement Our Common Agenda. Among other things, the Secretary-General notes: "I will also explore options to enhance parliamentary input at the United Nations, working with our existing partners."

This session will feature a presentation of the UNSG's Report on Our Common Agenda, with a particular focus on the ways and means by which parliaments can contribute to UN political outcomes and their implementation.

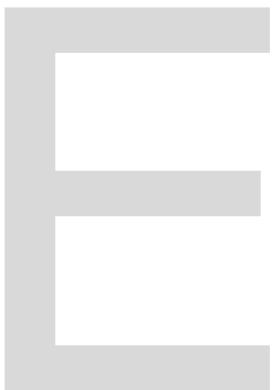

How preventive measures on online child sexual exploitation and abuse, and the education of children, can be age and gender-sensitive by taking into account the different needs of girls and boys, including in sex education and ICT awareness at school. The group will also discuss other strategies to empower children to understand their rights, protect themselves and report online sexual exploitation.

After a short presentation on the draft resolution, the Forum will split into the discussion groups. On the recommendation of its Bureau, the Forum will designate a chair and a rapporteur for each group. The rapporteurs will submit the groups' recommendations to the Forum of Women Parliamentarians at the following sitting.

6. Panel discussion on *Strategies for gender-responsive law making*

Parliaments are key to ensuring that national laws guarantee gender equality in practice. Gender-responsive law-making starts with ensuring that the rights of women and girls are fulfilled at all times. It is also about taking into account the views, needs and perspectives of women and girls in their diversity while making laws and ensuring that they deliver the desired outcomes. For that, parliamentarians must both adopt rights-affirming laws that protect and benefit all women and girls and be able to analyze the differentiated impact of legislation on them.

In 2021, the IPU and UN Women will be launching a handbook for parliamentarians on gender-responsive law making. Participants at the Forum of Women Parliamentarians will be presented with the main takeaways of the handbook and have an open discussion on their national experiences and lessons learned.

Parliamentarians attending the Forum will be invited to share experiences on strategies for law-making in a gender-responsive manner, including good practices in:

- Building alliances and political will: how to work across sectors for advancing gender-responsive legal reform
- Scaling up capacity: building internal expertise in parliament for gender-responsive legal analysis
- Having mechanisms to defend and promote gender equality in parliament: the role of cross-party groups and gender committees in fostering gender reform of legislation
- Ensuring enforcement of legislation: how to advance parliamentary oversight and allocate budgets to translate laws into reality

Panellists will be invited to introduce each of the strategic areas one-by-one. The moderator will then give the floor to participants wishing to contribute examples of good practices under each of these areas.

7. Reports of the discussion group rapporteurs

The discussion group rapporteurs will present their reports. The Forum will then ask them to consult with the President of the Bureau of Women Parliamentarians and prepare amendments to be presented during the debate of the Standing Committee on Democracy and Human Rights.

8. Elections to the Bureau of Women Parliamentarians

The Forum of Women Parliamentarians will be called upon to fill the vacant seat on the Bureau of Women Parliamentarians and to approve the candidate for Second Vice-President selected by the Bureau.

The Forum will receive opening remarks from the IPU President, the IPU Secretary General, and the President of the IPU Board of the Forum of Young Parliamentarians.

3. Updates on youth participation

The Forum will take stock of recent developments in global and national youth participation in parliament. The young parliamentarians will reflect on successes and current challenges, draw conclusions and make recommendations.

The President of the Board will give an overview of what the IPU has done since May 2021 to support youth participation and the activities planned for 2022. The floor will then be opened to members of the Forum to discuss both these past and planned future activities. A special focus will be placed on the IPU campaign *I Say Yes to Youth in Parliament!* and new training courses for young MPs.

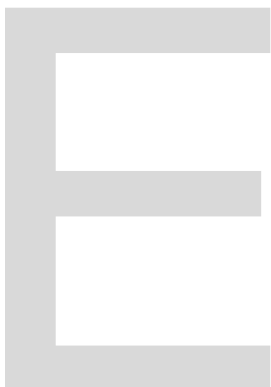
4. Contribution to the work of the 143rd Assembly

In line with the objective of the Forum to mainstream youth perspectives in the work and decisions of the Assembly, members of the Forum will exchange views from a youth perspective on:

- The theme of the General Debate of the 143rd Assembly on “*Contemporary challenges to democracy. Overcoming division and building community*”
- The draft resolution under consideration at the 143rd Assembly, entitled *Legislation worldwide to combat online child sexual exploitation and abuse*.

5. Q&A session on the topic: *Forums of young parliamentarians: A success story?*

An increasing number of parliaments have established forums of young parliamentarians. IPU’s research shows that these exist in about 16 per cent of parliaments, and have often focused on: networking and capacity-building of young parliamentarians; coordination of parliamentary action on youth issues; engagement of parliamentarians of all ages to work on youth-related policies; and on coordination of young MPs with civil society. A number of international and regional inter-parliamentary organizations have also established forums of young



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MPs or plan to do so. Some forums have used the IPU's Forum of Young Parliamentarians as a model to define their own mandate and functioning.

What works and what doesn't work? What are the keys to successful and impactful forums of young MPs? This interactive Q&A session will look into these main questions and take stock of developments in the creation and good functioning of forums of young parliamentarians.

The objective of the Q&A session is to offer a platform for young MPs to tell the story of the forum of young MPs in their parliament. Young parliamentarians are invited to come prepared to share in 2 minutes :

- Stories behind the establishment of a forum of young MPs, including challenges faced and solutions found; or
- Lessons learned on what should be the mandate and scope of work of a forum of young MPs in parliament; or
- A highlight story of when the caucus of young MPs made a particularly successful impact; or
- An example of cooperation with a caucus of young MPs from another country or from an inter-parliamentary organization.

As speaking time will be limited to 2 minutes during the Q&A session, young MPs are encouraged to share more thorough contributions to one or more of the topics listed above in writing.

6. Preparations for the 144th Assembly (March 2022)

As per usual practice, the Forum will prepare for the 144th Assembly by discussing from a youth perspective the items on the agenda of the IPU Standing Committees: *Rethinking and reframing approaches to peace processes with a view to fostering lasting peace*, to be considered by the Standing Committee on Peace and International Security; and *Leveraging Information and Communication Technology as an enabler for the education sector, including in times of pandemic* to be considered by the Standing Committee on Sustainable Development. The members of the Forum will be invited to approve the appointment of a Rapporteur nominated by the Board of the Forum of Young Parliamentarians to provide a youth overview report on each of these items to the respective Standing Committee.

Workshop on *Good parliamentary practices to promote interfaith dialogue*

Sunday, 28 November 2021, 16:00 – 18:00

Concept Note

With four out of five people worldwide professing a religious faith,¹ human mobility on the rise and religion-driven violent extremism a very real concern for many societies, the question of the role of parliaments and parliamentarians in promoting interfaith dialogue and peaceful coexistence is highly topical.

The key functions of parliaments – law-making, budgeting, representation and oversight – make them the guardians of the rule of law, citizenship, human rights and justice in our societies. The IPU Declaration on *Promoting cultural pluralism and peace through interfaith and inter-ethnic dialogue*, adopted on the occasion of the 137th IPU Assembly in St. Petersburg in 2017, recalls the obligation of national authorities to build inclusive societies which promote sustainable and peaceful diversity in order to combat divisive narratives, intolerance and violence. It also encourages parliamentarians to engage with cultural stakeholders and religious leaders, guided by the principles of transparency, accountability and the rule of law.

The setting of the 143rd IPU Assembly in a region that was a global centre for interreligious coexistence in the Middle Ages, and which has been the setting for many historic interfaith and intercultural events in recent times, affords a unique opportunity to convene a workshop on ***Good parliamentary practices to promote interfaith dialogue***. The workshop will bring together parliamentarians, representatives of the United Nations and experts working in different religious, geographical and cultural contexts to share insights into the important role of parliaments in promoting the peaceful coexistence of people of different faiths and those of no faith, especially through the passing of legislation that guarantees freedom of religion or belief, the promotion of equal rights for all religious communities, as well as taking measures to prevent and counter hate speech and promote a culture of tolerance and understanding.

Participants are invited to share good practices being implemented by parliaments and parliamentarians at the national and regional level, as well as the different challenges they face. The deliberations of this workshop will also contribute to the design of the *World Conference on Intercultural and Interfaith Dialogue: Working together for peace and humanity*, which is being organized by the IPU in cooperation with the United Nations and will be held in St Petersburg on 16-18 May 2022.

The workshop will explore the following questions:

- What are examples of model legislation and good practices at the national and regional level that promote interfaith dialogue and peaceful coexistence?

- Does your parliament have a specialized committee or structure dealing with interfaith and intercultural dialogue and, if so, what are its core mandate and functions?
- What kinds of challenges are being faced in reconciling religious identity and citizenship, and how can these be addressed?
- What are some examples of how measures to promote citizenship have strengthened social cohesion or prevented radicalization?
- What measures are needed to strengthen citizenship, the rule of law and statehood to create strong and resilient multi-faith societies?
- What major issues can parliaments anticipate facing in the future?
- What contribution can the IPU make to promoting national or international parliamentary dialogue around and interest in interfaith issues?

DPR Minta Dunia Jangan Lupakan Palestina

Situasi kemanusiaan warga Palestina di wilayah pendudukan dinilai semakin memburuk. Laporan dari PBB maupun berbagai laporan badan-badan independen menyatakan bahwa Palestina terkena dampak krisis yang berkepanjangan. Meningkatnya ketegangan di Yerusalem Timur, eskalasi ketegangan di Jalur Gaza sejak Mei 2021, dan pandemi Covid-19 yang sedang berlangsung semakin memperparah situasi.

Ketua Badan Kerja Sama Antar Parlemen (BKSAP) DPR RI Fadli Zon mengatakan masing-masing negara diharapkan tidak melupakan Palestina. "Kami khawatir karena kesibukan masing-masing negara menghadapi berbagai tantangan mendesak seperti perubahan iklim, kemunduran demokrasi, kemiskinan dan sebagainya,

kemudian isu Palestina ini menjadi terpinggirkan,” kata Fadli Zon dari Madrid, Spanyol, Minggu (28/11/2021).

Pada Sidang ke-143 Inter Parliamentary Union (IPU) yang untuk pertama kalinya diselenggarakan secara tatap muka dengan yang dihadiri 179 parlemen nasional dan 13 parlemen regional, BKSAP mengajukan *emergency item* mengenai situasi kemanusiaan di Palestina. *Emergency item* yang diusung Indonesia adalah mengenai krisis kemanusiaan di Palestina. “Dunia berutang pada rakyat Palestina atas kemerdekaan yang direnggut dari mereka. Oleh karena itu dibutuhkan lebih banyak lagi dukungan politis bagi upaya kemerdekaan Palestina,” tambah Fadli.

Politisi Partai Gerindra itu menambahkan, pandemi global Covid-19 juga sangat mempengaruhi kondisi Negara Palestina. Secara kumulatif, terdeteksi lebih dari 150 ribu orang tertular virus Covid-19. Anak-anak dan perempuan menjadi kelompok paling rentan. Pembatasan akses ke layanan penting seperti pendidikan, kesehatan, nutrisi, air dan sanitasi, serta layanan perlindungan sosial lainnya makin memperburuk situasi.

Oleh sebab itu, rakyat Palestina membutuhkan dukungan terus menerus dari dunia internasional. Melalui diplomasi parlemen, BKSAP terus mendukung aspirasi rakyat Palestina untuk negara Palestina yang merdeka, demokratis, berdaulat dan layak. Selain itu, BKSAP juga menggalang solidaritas global melalui partisipasi di forum-forum antar parlemen.

Menanggapi hal tersebut, kelompok geopolitikal regional ASEAN+3, Asia Pasifik, Parlemen negara OKI dan Parlemen Asia telah menyampaikan dukungannya. Akan tetapi pada detik-detik terakhir sebelum voting, masuk usulan baru dari kelompok parlemen negara Afrika mengenai akses dan ketersediaan vaksin Covid-19.

Setelah melalui *lobby* dan negosiasi serta mencermati perkembangan terkini, Indonesia memutuskan untuk menarik usulan *emergency item*. Aspek urgensi di tengah maraknya varian baru Covid-19 yakni Omicron yang dinilai bisa lima kali lebih menular dari varian aslinya menjadi salah satu pertimbangan utama.

Tentunya hal ini tidak berarti Indonesia mengenyampingkan isu Palestina. Negara-negara anggota IPU, perlu menjaga komitmen penuh kepada rakyat Palestina untuk memenuhi hak-hak dasar menentukan nasib sendiri, dan penciptaan Palestina yang merdeka. Solusi dua negara tetap menjadi opsi terbaik dalam upaya ikut serta memelihara perdamaian dan keamanan internasional dan regional. Isu Palestina sendiri akan diajukan kembali tahun depan pada Sidang ke 144 IPU di Bali. **(bia/sf)**

Puteri Komarudin Ajak Parlemen Dunia Pastikan Proses Legislasi yang Responsif Gender

Anggota Badan Kerja Sama Antar Parlemen (BKSAP) DPR RI Puteri Anetta Komarudin mendorong adanya reformasi hukum yang responsif gender guna wujudkan kesetaraan gender. Dalam Sidang Umum ke-143 Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) yang berlangsung 26-30 November 2021 di Madrid, Spanyol, Puteri mengatakan upaya untuk menjamin terpenuhinya hak-hak perempuan melalui produk hukum yang responsif gender' Light
diperjuangkan oleh Kaukus Perempuan Parlemen RI (KPPRI) di DPR.

“Kaukus memberikan ruang bagi anggota dewan, baik perempuan maupun laki-laki untuk berkomitmen dan bekerja sama dalam menjamin agenda penyusunan undang-undang yang responsif gender,” ungkap Puteri sebagai narasumber diskusi panel dalam Sidang ke-32 Forum Anggota Parlemen Perempuan sebagai rangkaian dari Sidang Umum IPU, Jumat (26/11/2021).

Sidang Umum ke-143 IPU dihadiri delegasi dari 179 negara anggota, termasuk Indonesia. Dalam diskusi panel bertajuk *Strategies For Gender-Responsive Law Making: Partnerships Needed To Conduct Gender-Responsive Legal Reform*, Anggota Komisi XI DPR RI itu menyampaikan pengalaman terkait hubungan kemitraan yang dibangun KPPRI dalam mendorong reformasi hukum yang responsif gender.

Dalam pidatonya, Puteri menjelaskan lebih lanjut terkait strategi KPPRI dalam pengarusutamaan gender di DPR RI. “KPPRI fokus mendorong kemampuan politik perempuan melalui kegiatan advokasi dan pengembangan kapasitas. Melalui advokasi, kami dorong terpenuhinya kuota keterwakilan minimum sebesar 30 persen bagi perempuan di lembaga-lembaga politik dan partai politik. Bersamaan dengan itu, kami juga tingkatkan kapasitas politik dan legislasi. Kami juga terus menjalin kerja sama dengan berbagai elemen masyarakat, akademisi, dan sektor swasta untuk mendukung kiprah perempuan di berbagai lini,” jelas Puteri.

Puteri yang juga menjadi Anggota Biro Perempuan Parlemen IPU (Bureau of Women Parliamentarians) perwakilan Grup Asia-Pasifik juga menjelaskan bahwa KPPRI tengah memperkaya peran pengawasan yang dimiliki melalui mekanisme pemantauan dan peninjauan terhadap undang-undang atau Post Legislative Scrutiny. Kewenangan ini diatur dalam Undang-Undang (UU) Nomor 15 Tahun 2019 yang merevisi UU Nomor 12 Tahun 2011 tentang Pembentukan Peraturan Perundang-Undangan.

“Fungsi pemantauan dan peninjauan UU terus kami pelajari agar bisa segera kami implementasikan untuk mengawasi pelaksanaan UU. Sehingga harapannya mekanisme ini juga dapat digunakan untuk mengidentifikasi dan menemukan regulasi yang dianggap tidak responsif gender maupun diskriminatif,” tutur Puteri.

Menutup pidatonya, politisi Partai Golkar itu mengajak para anggota parlemen perempuan dunia untuk terus menjalin kerja sama. “Reformasi hukum yang responsif gender pasti berbeda-beda pelaksanaannya di tiap negara. Karenanya, kita perlu memperkuat konsolidasi dan komunikasi melalui forum-forum internasional seperti ini untuk berbagi pengalaman dan belajar satu sama lain,” tutup Puteri. **(ann/sf)**



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
