BKSAP Ready to Exercise Parliamentary Diplomacy to Bring South Sumatra Forward

These forums include the Inter Parliamentary Union (IPU), Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA), Asia Pacific Parliamentary Forum (APPF), ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Assembly (AIPA), and Parliamentary Union of the OIC Member States (PUIC).

Tohir, who is also a member of the House Commission XI on Finance and Banking, invited the South Sumatra Provincial Government to capitalize on bilateral and multilateral diplomacy in taking South Sumatra's economic potential abroad.

During the discussion, several issues of mutual interest for the progress of South Sumatra were also raised, including tourism, cooperation between universities, infrastructure, and rubber production.
