I. PENDAHULUAN

A. LATAR BELAKANG

Sidang Pleno *Asian Parliamentary Assembly* (APA) ke-13 kembali digelar secara luring di Baku, Azerbaijan pada 17-21 Februari 2025. Pleno tersebut dihadiri oleh perwakilan delegasi dari 26 Parlemen Anggota APA dan perwakilan dari 7 organisasi parlemen.

Tema utama yang menjadi puncak pertemuan insan parlemen Asia tersebut adalah *Role of Parliamentary Diplomacy in Strengthening Multilatera Cooperation in Asia.* Partisipan menyampaikan pandangan terkait peran diplomasi parlemen sebagai suara rakyat dalam kerangka menyikapi pelbagai tantangan atau ancaman kawasan dan global terutama terkait perdamaian dan keamanan.

Untuk diketahui, APA merupakan organisasi kerja sama antarparlemen di Asia dengan 43 negara anggota. APA sendiri merupakan kelanjutan dari *Association of Asian Parliamentarian for Peace* (AAPP). Pada sidang ke-7 AAPP, di Tehran, Iran AAPP resmi bertransformasi menjadi APA.

Pembentukan APA diharapkan dapat memainkan peran strategis yaitu antara lain: (i) mempromosikan perdamaian, keadilan sosial, dan kebersamaan; (ii) sharing akses iptek di semua bidang; (iii) kerja sama pengelolaan SDM dan SDA; (iv) kerja sama kesehatan dan gizi; (v) berkontribusi terhadap integrasi di antara negara Asia dalam kerangka mendayagunakan potensi di Asia.

Fokus pembahasan APA juga dikembangkan mencakup aspek ekonomi, sosial dan nilai-nilai budaya di Asia. Pembahasan isu-isu penting di APA tersebut telah memberikan kontribusi positif dalam mendukung pelaksanaan tugas Pemerintah terutama dalam mendukung pelaksanaan politik luar negeri.

Misi partisipasi Delegasi DPR RI ke Pleno APA ke-15 ini adalah untuk terus menyuarakan sikap DPR RI, dalam rangka mendukung posisi kebijakan Politik Luar Negeri Pemerintah, terhadap sejumlah isu krusial kawasan dan global antara lain perubahan iklim, ekonomi, politik keamanan, sosial dan budaya,

perempuan, kemiskinan, Agenda Pembangunan Berkelanjutan, dan secara spesifik terkait krisis di Jalur Gaza.

D. MAKSUD DAN TUJUAN PENGIRIMAN DELEGASI

Maksud pengiriman Delegasi DPR RI ke Sidang Pleno ke-15 *Asian Parliamentary Assembly* (APA) pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan yaitu:

- Berpartisipasi dalam seluruh rangkaian Sidang APA untuk bertukar pandangan dan pengalaman terkait isu-isu kawasan yaitu politik, keamanan, ekonomi, dan sosial budaya.
- 2) Menyampaikan berbagai masukan dan perubahan terhadap rancangan resolusi sesuai dengan posisi dan kepentingan kebijakan luar negeri Indonesia, termasuk terkait krisis di Jalur Gaza.
- 3) Menghasilkan laporan dan rekomendasi untuk kemudian dibahas dan diputuskan dalam Sidang Pleno APA.

Adapun tujuan pengiriman Delegasi DPR RI ke Sidang Pleno ke-15 *Asian Parliamentary Assembly* (APA) pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan yaitu:

- 1) Memanfaatkan Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA untuk mempertahankan hubungan multilateral DPR RI dengan parlemen negara-negara Asia.
- 2) Memperkuat eksistensi dan kontribusi Parlemen Indonesia dalam berbagai pengambilan keputusan regional melalui APA.
- 3) Menegaskan komitmen Parlemen Indonesia terhadap upaya-upaya untuk menentukan arah perkembangan organisasi APA dan mendorong peran aktif APA di kawasan Asia di masa-masa mendatang.
- 4) Melaksanakan peran diplomasi parlemen sebagai salah satu unsur penting *total diplomacy* dalam kerangka mendukung pendekatan multilateral dalam mengatasi berbagai permasalahan kawasan sejalan dengan kebijakan luar negeri dan kepentingan nasional RI.

E. MISI DELEGASI

Misi Delegasi DPR RI menghadiri Sidang Pleno ke-15 Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA) pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan adalah memperjuangkan kepentingan nasional Indonesia agar terakomodir dalam rancangan-rancangan resolusi yang dibahas, meliputi isu-isu pencapaian tujuan pembangunan berkelanjutan, pertumbuhan ekonomi, perubahan iklim, energi, kerja sama sosial budaya dan perempuan.

Misi lainnya adalah memperjuangkan isu kemanusiaan di Gaza dan pada saat yang sama mengukuhkan komitmen dan kepemimpinan Indonesia di kawasan Asia dalam mewujudkan perdamaian abadi dan stabilitas kawasan dan dunia.

F. PERSIAPAN PELAKSANAAN TUGAS

Serangkaian kegiatan dilakukan pada masa persiapan partisipasi Delegasi DPR RI ke Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan, baik dari segi teknis maupun dari sisi substansi.

Dalam kerangka kelancaran tugas Delegasi dari segi teknis, Sekretariat BKSAP DPR RI menyiapkan sarana dan prasarana yang mendukung bagi keikutsertaan Delegasi dalam Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA. Sementara dari sisi substansi, Sekretariat bersama Tenaga Ahli BKSAP DPR RI telah menyusun usulan amandemen rancangan-rancangan resolusi, posisi, dan *statement* delegasi, dengan mempertimbangkan masukan dari sejumlah stakeholder terutama Kementerian Luar Negeri RI.

G. ANGGARAN

Kegiatan partisipasi Delegasi DPR RI pada Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan ini menggunakan anggaran APBN dari anggaran perjalanan dinas yang telah dialokasikan pada DIPA Satuan Kerja Dewan Tahun Anggaran 2025 sebesar Rp. 1.636.880.000,00 (Satu Milyar Enam Ratus Tiga Puluh Enam Juta Delapan Ratus Delapan Puluh Ribu Rupiah).

II. ISI LAPORAN

A. AGENDA SIDANG

Sidang Pleno ke-15 *Asian Parliamentary Assembly* di Baku, Azerbaijan dilaksanakan selama 5 (empat) hari pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 yang dihadiri oleh 26 (dua puluh enam) negara anggota APA.

Adapun agenda yang dibahas pada Sidang Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku, Azerbaijan adalah sebagai berikut:

B. SITUASI UMUM PERSIDANGAN DAN PARTISIPASI DELEGASI DPR RI

APA Executive Council Meeting

Rangkaian kegiatan Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA diawali dengan Sidang Dewan Eksekutif (*the Executive Council Meeting*) yang berlangsung di hari pertama yaitu pada 18 Februari 2025. Sidang dipimpin oleh Rizvan Nabiyev (Parlemen Azerbaijan). Delegasi DPR RI yang menghadiri sidang ini adalah **Bapak Dr. Syahrul Aidi Maazat** didampingi oleh Staf Sekretariat dan Tenaga Ahli BKSAP DPR RI.

Secara umum Sidang Dewan Eksekutif berjalan lancar dan dinamis. Para peserta menyampaikan hal-hal yang berkaitan dengan korganisasian APA, terutama terkait gagasan untuk menyederhanakan draf-draf resolusi agar draf-draf lama yang sudah diadopsi tidak diajukan kembali di pertemuan selanjutnya sebagai draf-draf resolusi. Namun gagasan ini belum dapat disepakati. Pasalnya, draf-draf yang sudah diadopsi dapat diamandemen sesuai dengan perkembangan terbaru.



Isu krisis di Jalur Gaza juga mendapat perhatian luas selama sidang termasuk dari Delegasi Indonesia. Dalam kaitan tersebut, Bapak Syahrul menyampaikan bahwa perjuangan bangsa Palestina adalah salah satu masalah yang paling penting karena berkaitan erat dengan isu kemanusiaan, kebebasan, dan keadilan.

Lebih lanjut disampaikan bahwa keadaan mengerikan yang terjadi di Palestina berakar dari penjajahan atau pendudukan Israel, yang telah berlangsung selama lebih dari tujuh dekade. Oleh karena itu, berdasarkan konstitusi Indonesia, Parlemen dan Pemerintah Indonesia tidak akan pernah memiliki hubungan dan ikatan diplomatik dengan Israel sang penjajah.

la juga menegaskan bahwa Jalur Gaza dewasa ini tengah pada situasi lebih kritis karena kesepakatan gencatan senjata saat ini menjadi lebih rapuh terutama disebabkan oleh tindakan provokatif Donald Trump yang akan mengambil alih Jalur Gaza dan akan menggusur warga Gaza dari Jalur Gaza. Oleh sebab itu, APA harus memperkokoh posisinya agar lebih terpadu dan bersatu, baik di tingkat regional maupun global, untuk menyelamatkan kesepakatan gencatan senjata yang sampai taraf tertentu telah membantu menyediakan situasi yang lebih kondusif bagi rakyat Palestina di Jalur Gaza, terutama dalam kerangka penyaluran akses bantuan kemanusiaan global.

Isu krusial lain yang menyeruak di persidangan adalah pembahasan posisi presidensi APA untuk masa jabatan berikutnya. Parlemen Islam Iran dan Parlemen Bahrain mengajukan diri untuk posisi tersebut.

Melalui konsultasi dan diskusi yang konstruktif, sidang berhasil menyepakati Parlemen Bahrain sebagai Presiden APA untuk periode tahun 2026 dan Parlemen Islam Iran sebagai Presiden APA untuk periode tahun 2027.

Sidang juga berhasil menyepakati posisi empat Wakil Presiden APA untuk tahun 2025 yaitu Rusia, Qatar, dan Bahrain.

Sidang juga meliputi beberapa hal penting yaitu: (1) penyampaian laporan Sekretaris Jenderal APA terkait kegiatan APA selama tahun 2024/2025; (2) menyetujui permohonan Kesultanan Oman untuk keanggotaan penuh APA dan permohonan Republik Belarus untuk status pengamat APA untuk diajukan ke Pleno **APA** untuk mendapatkan persetujuan: mempertimbangkan berbagai rancangan resolusi dari empat komisi APA yang berhasil diadopsi untuk persetujuan akhir di Pleno APA; (4) mempertimbangkan laporan Kelompok Kerja Dokumen Hukum di Bahrain dan Irak terkait Pasal 5 dan 8 Piagam APA dan Aturan 15 dan 34.1 Aturan Tata Tertib APA untuk ditinjau di mana sidang mempertimbangkan dan menyetujui amandemen yang diusulkan dan merekomendasikannya kepada Sidang Paripurna ke-15 untuk persetujuan akhir. Secara prinsip, Sidang Eksekutif menyambut baik keputusan penting mengenai pembayaran yang setara dan hak suara yang setara, mengakui bahwa anggaran APA sangat penting untuk fungsinya yang efektif, dan meminta semua Negara Anggota untuk mengambil langkah-langkah yang diperlukan guna mengalokasikan dana yang dibutuhkan; (5) merekomendasikan Komite Palestina untuk melanjutkan tugasnya sebagai subkomite dari Komite Tetap Politik.



Inaugural Ceremony

Sidang Pembukaan Sidang Pleno APA ke-15 dihelat pada tanggal 19 Februari 2025, di Baku, Republik Azerbaijan. Parlemen Anggota APA yang menghadiri pembukaan tersebut adalah: Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Bhutan, Kamboja, Tiongkok, Siprus, **Indonesia**, India, Iran, Irak, Yordania, Kazakhstan, Kirgistan, Laos, Lebanon, Oman, Pakistan, Palestina, Qatar, Rusia, Arab Saudi, Tajikistan, Thailand, Turki, UEA, dan Uzbekistan. Pembukaan juga dihadiri oleh oleh observer yaitu IPC, IPACIS, Liga Anggota Parlemen untuk Al Quds, TURKPA, PABSEC, PUIC dan satu undangan yaitu CICA.



Pertemuan tersebut dibuka dengan pidato oleh Sahiba Gafarova, Ketua Milli Mejlis Azerbaijan yang menyampaikan sejumlah bidang prioritas yang ditetapkan sebagai bagian dari tanggung jawab Presiden APA, termasuk mengembangkan kapasitas kelembagaan APA, memperluas keanggotaannya, dan merevitalisasi lembaga yang ada, serta meningkatkan efisiensi kapasitas organisasi.

Pidato kedua di sesi pembukaan tersebut disampaikan oleh Sekretaris Jenderal APA, Mohammad Reza Majidi, yang menegaskan komitmennya untuk mempercepat kemajuan program-programnya APA di tahun-tahun mendatang. Ia juga menggarisbawahi peran penting diplomasi parlemen di tengah situasi krusial saat ini ketika seluruh dunia menghadapi tantangan yang beraneka ragam. Ia juga mengecam kebijakan sepihak yang dilakukan secara global yang melanggar semua aturan dan norma internasional dengan

tujuan merusak perdamaian dan keamanan termasuk krisis kemanusiaan yang sedang berlangsung di Jalur Gaza setelah 15 bulan kejahatan perang Entitas Zionis.

Plenary Session

Sidang Pleno diselenggarakan setelah Sesi Pembukaan. Agenda utama sesi pleno tersebut adalah *General Debate* di mana representasi Delegasi APA menyampaikan pandangannya terkait tema utama Sidang APA ke-15 yaitu *Role of Parliamentary Diplomacy in Strengthening Multilatera Cooperation in Asia.*

Delegasi DPR RI merupakan satu-satunya anggota APA yang diberikan kesempatan dua kali untuk menyampaikan pandangannya di *General Debate* yaitu oleh **Ketua DPR RI Dr. (HC) Puan Maharani** dan **Ketua BKSAP DPR RI Dr. Mardani Ali Sera**.



Ketua DPR RI pada sesi tersebut menekankan bahwa diplomasi parlemen harus secara aktif berkontribusi untuk menciptakan perdamaian yang adil dan langgeng. Hal tersebut penting untuk menyelesaikan masalah global karena masalah tersebut secara langsung memengaruhi konstituen anggota parlemen di lapangan.

Lebih lanjut ditegaskan urgensi penyelesaian damai atas perang dan konflik di Gaza, Ukraina, dan bagian lain dunia. Ia secara leibh khusus mengajak seluruh parlemen Asia memastikan gencatan senjata di Gaza dilaksanakan,

menjamin akses bantuan kemanusiaan bagi rakyat Palestina, dan menolak gagasan untuk merelokasi penduduk Gaza dari tanah air mereka.

Di sisi lain, Ketua DPR mendorong semua yang hadir pada KTT APA ke-15 untuk mengambil tindakan berani dan mengesampingkan perbedaa, terlebih lagi saat ini dunia berada dalam era ketidakpastian yang besar. Terakhir, ia pun menyinggung soal isu kesetaraan semua negara hingga pentingnya tercipta perdamaian global, termasuk bagi Palestina.



Sementara itu, Ketua BKSAP DPR menyampaikan sejumlah hal strategis yaitu: (1) mengingatkan ihwal kebijakan Donald Trump yang dapat menyulut krisis multilateralisme di mana Trump mempromosikan unilateralisme dan proteksionisme; (2) menyoroti Survei Persepsi Risiko Global 2024-2025 terbaru yang diluncurkan oleh Forum Ekonomi Dunia. Survei tersebut mengungkap lanskap risiko terkini yang mencakup konflik bersenjata berbasis negara, peristiwa cuaca ekstrem, konfrontasi geoekonomi, misinformasi dan disinformasi, polarisasi masyarakat, kemerosotan ekonomi, perubahan kritis pada sistem bumi, kurangnya peluang ekonomi atau pengangguran, erosi hak asasi manusia dan/atau kebebasan sipil, dan ketidaksetaraan. Survei tersebut telah memberikan gambaran yang sangat jelas bahwa dunia saat ini dilumpuhkan oleh banyak tantangan besar yang mendesak, yang membahayakan perdamaian, keamanan, dan kehidupan manusia secara umum; (3) mengingatkan bahwa dewasa ini di sebagian besar belahan dunia masih dipenuhi oleh permusuhan dan kebencian yang terwujud dalam bentuk unilateralisme, pendudukan, apartheid, eksploitasi, dan diskriminasi sebagai cara berinteraksi antarbangsa di dunia; (4) menyampaikan keprihatinan sangat mendalam terkait masih terus

berlanjutnya penderitaan rakyat Palestina sejak lebih dari tujuh dekade akibat pendudukan brutal Israel; (5) menegaskan APA sebagai sebagai satu-satunya platform parlemen yang menghimpun parlemen di kawasan Asia harus mampu memanfaatkan komponen-komponen potensinya untuk menjadikan dunia lebih baik, menghadirkan keadilan dan kewajaran bagi semua dengan tidak ada satu negara pun di dunia kebal dari hukum.

Sidang Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development APA



Meeting of Standing on Economic and Sustainable Development dilaksanakan pada 20 Februari 2025 dan membahas 7 (tujuh) Rancangan Resolusi mengenai isu energi, lingkungan, pertumbuhan ekonomi, pengentasan kemiskinan, pengimplementasian agenda pembangunan berkelanjutan, air dan sanitasi, serta perubahan iklim.

Sidang dipimpin oleh Ahmed Alsalloom (Parlemen Bahrain) di mana forum menyepakati agenda draf agenda pertemuan. Dalam pengantarnya, Alsalloom menyambut para peserta dan menyatakan bahwa semua 7 rancangan resolusi yang akan dipertimbangkan telah dibahas secara ekstensif di Manama dan ditinjau selama Dewan Eksekutif di Baku, oleh karena itu forum berada pada posisi yang tepat untuk meminta Sidang Paripurna untuk pengesahannya.

Namun demikian, forum kemudian mengusulkan agar tujuh rancangan resolusi tersebut dilihat lagi secara cepat untuk diadopsi satu per satu. Para peserta menyambut baik usulan tersebut. Forum berhasil menyampaikan beberapa editorial/koreksi kecil yang dimasukkan ke dalam rancangan resolusi-resolusi tersebut.

INDONESIA

Sidang Standing Committee on Budget and Planning

Meeting of Standing on Budget and Planning membahas 1 (satu) Rancangan Resolusi mengenai rencana anggaran organisasi APA. Sidang tersebut dihelat pada 19 Februari 2025 dan dipimpin oleh Ahmad bin Hitmi Al-Hitmi dalam kapasitasnya sebagai Wakil Presiden APA.

Dalam pengantarnya, Al-Hitmi menegaskan bahwa saat rapat Komite Tetap Anggaran dan Perencanaan diadakan pada bulan November 2024 di Doha, Qatar telah diadposi resolusi Anggaran & Perencanaan tersebut. Disebutkan bahwa diperkirakan anggaran sejumlah satu juta USD per tahun bagi APA.

Forum menyepakati jumlah tersebut dibagi secara rata di antara 44 anggota APA sehingga masing-masing anggota APA dikenakan kewajiban membayar 22.000 USD. Namun juga kontribusi sukarela oleh anggota tertentu yang lebih kaya juga dapat dipertimbangkan. Demikian juga harus mempertimbangkan formula untuk menghukum anggota APA yang menahan atau menunda pembayaran juran wajibnya.

Sementara itu pihak Sekretariat APA menyampaikan harapan bahwa parlemen anggota APA dapat mulai membayar iuran wajibnya setelah Sidang Paripurna APA ke-15 mengadopsi resolusi terkait iuran ini.

Sidang Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs



Meeting of Standing on Social and Cultural Affairs membahas 13 (tiga belas) Rancangan Resolusi yang meliputi tentang isu-isu kerja sama budaya, integrasi Asia melalui pemanfaatan Teknologi Komunikasi dan Informasi, kesehatan, pemberantasan korupsi, keperempuanan, perdamaian kawasan, pemberantasan perdagangan narkotika dan obat-obatan terlarang, kepemudaan dan anak-anak, kesejahteraan masyarakat pengembangan Sumber Daya Manusia di Asia, turisme serta Komisi tentang Perempuan.

Sidang dihelat pada tanggal 19 Februari 2024, dan diketuai oleh Gennady Ordenov (Parlemen Rusia) yang dalam pengantarnya mengingatkan rapat Komite Tetap Urusan Sosial dan Budaya yang telah diselenggarakan pada bulan September 2024 di Moskow. Ketika di Rusia, 3 rancangan resolusi diperbarui dan diadopsi secara konsensus. Rancangan resolusi baru tentang dukungan tatanan dunia multipolar yang lebih adil diperkenalkan sebagai rancangan resolusi baru oleh Rusia dan diadopsi secara konsensus. Rancangan resolusi tentang "Komisi Perempuan" dibahas secara menyeluruh pada sesi Komite ini dan ditunda ke rapat berikutnya untuk dibahas lebih lanjut.

Namun demikian, forum kemudian mengusulkan agar tujuh rancangan resolusi tersebut dilihat lagi secara cepat untuk diadopsi satu per satu. Para peserta menyambut baik usulan tersebut. Forum berhasil menyampaikan beberapa editorial/koreksi kecil yang dimasukkan ke dalam rancangan resolusi-resolusi tersebut. Akhirnya, 13 rancangan resolusi berhasil diperbaharui untuk diajukan ke Pleno APA ke-15 untuk mendapatkan persetujuan akhir.

Sidang Standing Committee on Political Affairs



Meeting of Standing on Political Affairs diselenggaakan pada tanggal 20 Februari 2025 yang dipimpin oleh Jabbar Frayyeh Abbas Al Kinani (Parlemen Irak).

Dalam pengantarnya, Al Kinani meningatkan kembali bahwa Komite Tetap Urusan Politik pada tanggal 11-12 Januari 2025 di Baghdad, Republik Irak. Komite Tetap mengesahkan semua 8 rancangan resolusi dan menyerahkannya kepada Dewan Eksekutif. Delapan resolusi tersebut kembali dibahas stau per satu dan berhasil disepakati untuk mendapatkan persetujuan akhir dari Pleno APA ke-15. Penting dicatat bahwa selama pembahasan resolusi-resolusi tersebut, semua delegasi yang berpartisipasi menyatakan dukungan penuh dan solidaritas mereka terhadap rakyat Palestina.

Pertemuan Bilateral

Sebagai tambahan, Delegasi DPR RI di sela-sela persidangan, juga melakukan pertemuan bilateral yaitu:

Ketua DPR pada tanggal 19 Februari 2025 melakukan pertemuan dengan Ilham Aliyev, Presiden Azerbaijan. di Baku, Azerbaijan, Rabu (19/2/2025) waktu setempat. Dalam pertemuan tersebut disampaikan urgensi peningkatan kerja sama karena saat ini sudah ada pemberlakuan Visa on Arrival (VoA) resiprokal antarkedua negara untuk wisata dan untuk mempererat hubungan antarmasyarakat. Ia juga mendorong agar lebih

banyak pihak swasta kedua negara untuk melakukan promosi peningkatan perdagangan dan investasi. Ia menegaskan bahwa Azerbaijan merupakan salah satu mitra strategis bagi Indonesia di kawasan Eurasia. Hal lain yang disinggung yaitu urgensi peningkatan kerja sama dagang dan investasi khususnya di bidang industri pertahanan, energi baru dan terbarukan, dan konstruksi, pendidikan dan latihan bersama, pertukaran informasi dan teknologi. Disampaikan juga bagwa Aliyev mengundang perusahaan Indonesia untuk turut berpartisipasi dalam proyek-proyek rekonstruksi di wilayah Karabakh.

Pada 18 Februari 2025, Ketua DPR bertemu dengan Ketua Majelis Nasional Azerbaijan, Sahiba Gafarova. Keduanya juga membahas berbagai isu antara lain terkait hubungan bilateral Indonesia dan Azerbaijan yang akan memasuki usia 33 tahun. Disampaikan bahwa DPR RI periode 2024-2029 telah membentuk Grup Kerja Sama Bilateral (GKSB) Indonesia-Azerbaijan pada 30 Januari 2025 lalu untuk memperkuat hubungan antarparlemen. Lebih lanjut ditegaskan bahwa Azerbaijan merupakan salah satu mitra strategis bagi Indonesia di kawasan Eurasia. Beberapa isu disinggung antara lain: urgensi menurunkan hambatan perdagangan antara kedua negara, kerja sama energi, hubungan antar masyarakat (people-to-people contact) terutama yang melibatkan generasi muda, kerja sama sosial-budaya seperti pembukaan jurusan Bahasa Indonesia pada Azerbaijan University of Language, sektor pendidikan dan riset, situasi di Ukraina dan Gaza.

III. HASIL-HASIL YANG DICAPAI

Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA dengan tema "Role of Parliamentary Diplomacy in Strengthening Multilateral Cooperation in Asia" yang diselenggarakan pada tanggal 17 – 21 Februari 2025 di Baku-Azerbaijan secara luring ini menghasilkan 6 (enam) Report yaitu Final Report 15th APA Plenary Session, Report of the Second Executive Council Meeting, Report of the Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development, Report of Standing Committee on Budget and Planning, Report of the Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs dan Report of the Standing Committee on Political Affairs, serta berhasil mengadopsi 21 (dua puluh satu) Rancangan Resolusi dari 4 (empat) Sidang Standing Committee yaitu Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development, Standing Committee on Budget and Planning, Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs, dan Standing Committee on Political Affairs.

Sidang Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development berhasil mengadopsi 7 (tujuh) Rancangan Resolusi dari 7 (tujuh) Rancangan Resolusi yang disiapkan. dengan rincian sebagai berikut: 1) The Establishment of an Asian Energy Market; 2) Environmental Issues; 3) Financial Affairs: Ensuring Efforts for Economic Growth; 4) Poverty Eradication; 5) The Role of APA Parliaments in

Supporting the Implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals; 6) Water and Sanitation in Asia for All; 7) Asian Climate Financial Initiative.

Sidang Standing Committee on Budget and Planning berhasil mengadopsi 1 (satu) Rancangan Resolusi dari 1 (satu) Rancangan Resolusi, yaitu Draft Resolution on Planning APA Budget.

Sidang Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs berhasil mengadopsi 12 (dua belas) dari 13 (tiga belas) Rancangan Resolusi sebagai berikut: 1) Measures to Promote Cultural Diversity and Protect Cultural Heritage in Asia; 2) Asian Integration through Information and Communication Technology; 3) Collaboration on Health Equity in Asia; 4) Asian Parliamentarians against Corruption; 5) APA Women Parliamentarians; 6) Promoting Dialogue and Harmony among Followers of World Religions; 7) Legal and Legislative Cooperation in Combating the Smuggling of Cultural Items in Asia; 8) Effective Cooperation in Combating Illicit Drug Trafficking in Asia; 9) the Promotion of Quality Child and Youth Development for Sustainable Society in Asia; 10) Ageing Society in Asia; 11) Human Development in Asia; 12) Tourism Cooperation in Asia; 13) the Commission on Women.

Selain itu, Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA juga telah mengadopsi Baku Declaration yang berisi berisi sejumlah poin penting antara lain, yaitu: menegaskan komitmen terhadap Piagam Perserikatan Bangsa-Bangsa, norma dan prinsip hukum internasional yang diakui secara universal, dan Piagam APA; mendukung penguatan multilateralisme dan mengadvokasi tata kelola global yang lebih efisien, inklusif, dan transparan serta tatanan yang berdasarkan hukum internasional; menolak segala tekanan politik dan ekonomi yang melanggar hukum terhadap Negara Anggota mana pun; menggerakkan semua upaya untuk mendorong perdamaian di Asia melalui penyelesaian sengketa secara damai, dengan memberikan bantuan kepada penduduk yang terkena dampak konflik, dan dengan mendorong pemulangan orang-orang terlantar secara aman dan bermartabat; meminta PBB dan masyarakat internasional untuk secara substansial meningkatkan pengiriman bantuan kemanusiaan ke Gaza, membangun kembali infrastruktur dan merehabilitasi masyarakat Gaza; menolak dengan tegas rencana/inisiatif asing apa pun terkait masa depan Palestina dan Gaza pascaperang, yang merupakan hak mutlak rakyat Palestina.

IV. PERTEMUAN LAIN

Selain kegiatan Sidang, Delegasi juga berkesempatan bertemu dengan Kuasa Usaha Ad Interim (KUAI) KBRI Baku di Azerbaijan, Ibu Merita Yenni dan jajarannya. Pertemuan dengan KBRI tersebut dilakukan dalam jamuan makan siang di selasela sidang APA.

KBRI menyampaikan bahwa jajaran KBRI selalu siap dalam mendukung kegiatan diplomasi yang dilakukan oleh DPR RI termasuk dalam menghadiri Sidang APA ini.







V. KESIMPULAN DAN REKOMENDASI

A. KESIMPULAN

- a. Sidang Pleno ke-15 APA pada tanggal 17-21 Februari 2025 di Baku– Azerbaijan berjalan dengan lancar, sukses, dan sesuai rencana. Delegasi DPR RI berpartisipasi aktif dalam beragam agenda persidangan dari awal hingga akhir.
- b. Pada Pleno APA 2025 ini, tema yang diangkat adalah: "Role of Parliamentary Diplomacy in Strengthening Multilateral Cooperation in Asia". Melalui tema tersebut, beberapa hal yang menjadi pokok pembicaraan antara lain: peran parlemen dalam upaya memajukan kerja sama multilateralisme untuk menghadapi berbagai tantangan Bersama terutama krisis kemanusiaan yang terjadi di Gaza, isu stabilitas dan keamanan kawasan, lingkungan, penguatan peran parlemen perempuan, pertumbuhan ekonomi kawasan serta kerja sama sosial dan budaya.

B. REKOMENDASI

- a. DPR RI sebaiknya rutin mengirimkan delegasi untuk menghadiri Sidang Pleno APA dikarenakan Indonesia memiliki posisi strategis di Kawasan Asia.
- b. Aspek pendanaan APA menjadi isu penting di mana sudah diputuskan kewajiban kontribusi bagi anggota APA. Dalam kaitan tersebut, DPR RI diharapkan segera berkordinasi dengan instansi terkait di dalam negeri perihal kewajiban kontribusi keuangan tahunan bagi APA mengingat penundaan atau penolakan pembayaran tersebut dapat memberikan dampak citra negatif Indonesia di kawasan Asia dan dapat mengurangi peran aktif DPR di APA.
- c. Agar dapat mendistribusikan resolusi-resolusi yang diputuskan dalam APA kepada seluruh pimpinan dan anggota BKSAP, serta komisi terkait di DPR RI, sehingga seluruh pihak tetap mendapatkan update mengenai proses dan hasil yang sudah dicapai APA selama ini, serta dapat membantu mengimplementasikannya.

VI. PENUTUP

1. The delegation of Parliament of the Islamic Republic of Iran, registered its reservation by stating that: "Documents adopted by the current meeting on Palestine should not explicitly or implicitly be construed in any way as recognition of the Israeli Zionist Regime." The delegation of the Parliament of the Islamic Republic of Iran expressed its reservation regarding paragraph 9 of the Baku Declaration and emphasized that the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) should be

achieved in accordance with the national laws of the Member Parliaments.

2. The following statement was received by the APA Secretariat from Parliamentary delegation of Russian Federation: "During the discussions at the Drafting Committee the delegation of the Russian Federation has requested to amend one of the paragraphs of the Baku Declaration with a view to exclude bilateral contentious issues from the text in accordance the of the with Rule 21 APARules of Procedure. This request was disregarded by the Chair. The Russian delegation has stressed that points which don't enjoy consensus should be amended or deleted.

Although the meeting of the Drafting Committee on Declaration was concluded, debates over the specific paragraph of the declaration between concerned delegations continued on the initiative of the Chair. Despite the arguments of the Russian delegation the text remained unchanged.

Due to the lack of consensus, the delegation of the Russian Federation informed the APA Secretary General in a written form of its views and requested the Secretariat to draw the APA Parliaments' attention to this matter". (Attachment VIII)

Report of the Chairperson of the Executive Council to the Plenary

Madam President,
Distinguished Delegates,
Dear Colleagues,

It is a great pleasure for me, as chairperson of the Executive Council and Representative of the APA President **H.E. Sahiba Gafarova**, the esteemed Speaker of the Milli Majlis of Azerbaijan, to welcome you all to the 15th Plenary Session of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly in Baku, the capital city of the Republic of Azerbaijan.

It is also an honor for me to present to the 15th APA Plenary the Report of the Executive Council meeting of 18 February 2025 in Baku:

1. Following adoption of the agenda of the Executive Council, the meeting elected members of the Bureau by acclamation as follows:

• Chairman: Azerbaijan

• Vice Chair: Jordan

Rapporteur : Bhutan

- 2. In my opening remarks as Chairperson of the Executive council I made the following points:
- Azerbaijan views the Asian Parliamentary Assembly as a unique platform for promoting Asian solidarity and cooperation across various fields und supports strengthening its organizational capacities.
- We are concerned about the situation in the Middle East and therefore we support efforts to reduce tensions in region and find a political solution.
- For the first time since decades, de facto peace has been established between Armenia and Azerbaijan, stability has been achieved on the ground.
- Despite the various challenges, around 300,000 Azerbaijani refugees displaced from Armenia are still waiting to return to their ancestral homes.
- We will continue to support efforts to achieve a just, lasting, and peaceful resolution to all outstanding issues in the greater Asian region in accordance with the fundamental norms and principles of international law.
- 3. The APA Secretary General, Dr. Majidi also presented his Report on the APA activities during the 2024/2025. Secretary General in his Report outlined the work of the four Standing Committees and other major events of the APA.
- 4. I am delighted to report to you that at yesterday's meeting, the Executive Council unanimously approved the application of the Sultanate of Oman for the full membership and the application of the Republic of Belarus for the APA observer status and sought the Plenary endorsement.
- 5. It is also my honor to report that the Executive Council, noting that the Islamic Republic of Iran and the Kingdom of Bahrain

had generously offered their candidacy for APA Presidency of 2026-2027, approved the following arrangements which have been agreed among them through good offices of APA Secretary General and under the chairmanship of the representative of the APA President:

- 1. Kingdom of Bahrain will hold the position of APA Presidency for 2026.
- 2. Islamic Republic of Iran will hold the position of APA Presidency for 2027-2028.
- 3. Iran as the APA vice-president will host the Standing Committee on Political Affairs in 2025.
- 4. Iran as the APA vice-president will host the Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development in 2026.
- 6. The Executive Council at yesterday's meeting, also reconfirmed the nomination of the Kingdom of Bahrain, the State of Qatar and Russia Federation for the three post of APA Vice Presidency and hosting of the Standing Committees for the 2025 and recommended them to the Plenary for endorsement.

- 7. As its main task, the Executive Council considered the draft resolutions adopted by Standing Committees on Social and Cultural Affairs, Budget, and Planning, Economic and Sustainable Development and Political Affairs. After debating several minor changes, all draft resolutions were approved by the Executive Council and recommended to the Plenary for the final approval.
- 8. The Executive Council considered the report on Working Group on Statutory Documents in Bahrain and Iraq. At these two meetings

Article 5 and 8 of the APA Charter and Rules 15 and 34.1 of the APA Rules of Procedure were reviewed. The text of the reviewed Articles of the APA Charter and Rules of the APA Rules of Procedure were presented by the APA Secretariat to the meeting. The Executive Council considered and approved the proposed amendments and recommended it to the 15th Plenary for the final approval.

- 8a. The Executive Council welcomed the crucial decision regarding equal payment and equal voting rights, recognize that the APA budget is essential for its effective functioning, and called on all Member States to take the necessary measures to allocate the required funds.
- 8b. The Executive Council endorsed the Recommendation of the Standing Committee that the Committee on Palestine continue its work as a subcommittee of the Political Standing Committee.
- 9. The report on the two meetings of the Committee on Palestine in Tehran and Baghdad were presented to the meeting.
- 10. APA Secretariat also reported on the four sessions of the APA Bureau on the sidelines of the Standing Committee meetings in Moscow, Doha, Manama, and Baghdad.
- 11. The Executive Council considered and adopt the draft Agenda of the 15th APA Plenary.

Report by the Secretary General on the work of the Organization

Mr. Chairman, Esteemed Delegates, Distinguished Colleagues,

It is with great pleasure and profound honor that I, as Secretary-General, extend my warmest welcome to all esteemed attendees of the 15th Plenary Session of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA) here in Baku, the magnificent capital of the Republic of Azerbaijan.

I am delighted that this landmark session is being convened under the esteemed leadership of **H.E. Sahiba Gafarova**, the highly respected Speaker of the **Milli Majlis of the Republic of Azerbaijan**.

Under Azerbaijan's guidance, and with the dedicated efforts of the four APA Vice-Presidents Bahrain, Iraq, Qatar, and Russia, we have successfully conducted our Standing Committee meetings, fulfilling the objectives outlined in the 14th APA Plenary Session.

Throughout 2024, the APA has remained steadfast in addressing key regional and global issues. Our first gathering of the year took place in Moscow in September, under the framework of the **Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs**. This meeting facilitated in-depth discussions on a range of vital topics, including cultural diversity, heritage preservation, health equity, anti-corruption measures, the fight against the smuggling of cultural artifacts, drug trafficking, youth and human development, tourism, and interfaith dialogue. A significant contribution from the Russian Federation introduced a timely draft resolution on the pursuit of a "More Just Multipolar World Order Reflecting Cultural and Civilizational Diversity." This draft resolution underscores the importance of equitable financial participation by all Member Parliaments, ensuring the sustainable operation of the APA and its Secretariat. I am confident that with the endorsement of this model by the 15th Plenary Session, the APA will take a substantial step toward achieving its noble goals with renewed confidence and shared commitment. On this occasion, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the Islamic Parliament of Iran for its continued financial and logistical support to the APA Secretariat since 2007.

In the area of **economic and sustainable development**, the APA remained deeply engaged throughout 2024. Our December meeting in Manama, Bahrain, provided a platform for rich discussions on energy markets, environmental policies, economic growth, poverty eradication, sustainable development goals (SDGs), and water and sanitation issues. Given the significance of these topics, I strongly encourage Member Parliaments to actively contribute proposals in the

form of draft resolutions for consideration at the next Standing Committee meeting.

On the **political front**, while the APA has consistently emphasized critical issues such as good governance, the rule of law, regional cooperation, and multilateralism, the dominant focus of 2024 has been the humanitarian crisis in Gaza. In response to the catastrophic conditions faced by the Palestinian people, the APA established the "Committee on Palestine," which convened twice: first in January 2024 in Tehran, Iran, and then in January 2025 in Baghdad, Iraq, alongside the APA Standing Committee on Political Affairs. During these sessions, the Committee reaffirmed the APA's unwavering support for the Palestinian cause and strongly condemned the massacre of civilians and acts of ethnic cleansing in Gaza perpetrated by the Zionist regime.

Between the 14th and 15th Plenary Sessions, we also made significant progress in reviewing and updating the APA's statutory documents. The APA Working Group on Statutory Documents convened in Manama, Bahrain, in December 2024, and in Baghdad, Iraq, in January 2025, where it conducted a comprehensive review of Article 5 and Article 8 of the APA Charter, as well as Rule 15 of the APA Rules of Procedure. The Executive Council has since approved these amendments and recommended them for formal endorsement by the Plenary. With their adoption, the mandate of the Working Group on Statutory Documents will have been successfully fulfilled.

Mr. Chairman, Esteemed Delegates, Distinguished Colleagues

As I conclude my report, I am pleased to announce that the Executive Council has approved **the Sultanate of Oman's** application for full APA membership and **the Republic of Belarus'** application for Observer Status. The unanimous support for these applications in the Plenary will further reinforce APA's role as a growing platform for parliamentary diplomacy and regional cooperation.

Furthermore, I would like to extend my deep appreciation to the Milli Majlis of Azerbaijan for selecting **the theme** "*The Role of Parliamentary Diplomacy in Strengthening Multilateral Cooperation in Asia*" for this 15th APA Plenary Session. This theme reflects our collective commitment to harnessing parliamentary diplomacy as an instrument for fostering multilateral cooperation and addressing common regional and global challenges.

Another significant agenda item at this Plenary Session is the nomination of the **APA President for 2026–2028**. I am pleased to report that at yesterday's Executive Council meeting, the Council reached a consensus on the nomination of Kingdom of Bahrain for the APA Presidency for 2026 and Islamic Republic of Iran for 2027-2028. I extend my heartfelt congratulations to Bahrain and Iran and I am confident that the two parliaments will receive the full support of the Plenary for this prestigious leadership role.

Moreover, I am delighted that the Executive Council has confirmed the candidacies of Bahrain, Qatar, Iran, and Russia as the **four Vice-Presidents**, along with their commitment to hosting the Standing Committee meetings. I congratulate them on their dedication and commend their leadership and professionalism in successfully organizing these critical meetings over the years. Looking ahead to 2025, I am confident that the **Bureau of the Assembly**, with its distinguished composition, will make crucial decisions to further advance the implementation of the APA's annual program of work.

They can be assured of the full support of all APA members and the Secretariat as they carry out their significant responsibilities.

Asian Parliamentary Assembly, 15th Plenary Session BAKU DECLARATION, 20 February 2025.

We, Members of Parliaments of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA) who attended the 15th Plenary Session of APA in Baku from 17 February to 21 February 2025, upon the invitation of H.E. Sahiba GAFAROVA, Speaker of the National Assembly of the Republic of Azerbaijan and President of APA:

Representing the Asian nations, which are bound by deeply-rooted ties of history, geography, culture, economy, politics and civilization;

Commending the amity and the friendly relations among the Asian Nations, while recognizing the need to reinforce all kind of international cooperation that is indispensable for realizing the objectives of the APA, i.e., the promotion of freedom, justice, strengthening progress and prosperity of its members and making better use of the region's vast human and natural resources in the interests of the member countries:

Recalling the principles of the Charter of the United Nations in their entirety and interconnection with each other, including those of sovereign equality, political independence and territorial integrity of all States, refraining from use of force or the threat of use of force in international relations and non-interference in the internal affairs of States:

Underlining the absolute value of multilateralism in fostering a more prosperous, peaceful and sustainable world and expressing their determination to promote multilateral cooperation;

Emphasizing the importance of parliamentary diplomacy in maintaining peace, security and stability in the world and in enhancing trust, cooperation and solidarity among nations;

Concerned over the ongoing conflicts, security challenges and the threats of terrorism in parts of Asia and the suffering of people affected by these conflicts, especially displaced people;

Welcoming the announcement of a deal to secure a ceasefire and the release of prisoners and hostages in Gaza and **stressing** the importance of full implementation of the deal, firstly, to ease sufferings caused by the conflict and expand the delivery of sustained humanitarian relief;

Stressing the centrality of promoting the rule of law, justice and good governance for realization of human rights and fundamental freedoms and **underscoring** in this regard the legislative authority of Parliaments;

Promoting tolerance, mutual understanding and respect for core human values by rejecting any form of discrimination, racism, xenophobia or Islamophobia;

Encouraging the importance of the effective inclusion of women and youth in social, cultural, economic and political affairs and decision-making in Asia as appropriate;

Expressing our will to boost regional cooperation in political, economic, commercial, social, environmental, healthcare, cultural and educational fields, including by strengthening inter-parliamentary dialogue in Asia;

Reiterating the significance of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly in the areas of health, education, housing, food security, nutrition, poverty eradication and environmental sustainability;

Noting that a healthy environment is a prerequisite and key enabler for sustainable development and social welfare, and that the adverse impacts of climate change affect vulnerable countries the most, **highlighting** the need for enhancing the individual and collective capacity of Asian countries to address climate risks;

Noting the successful outcomes of the 29th session of the Conference of Parties (COP29) to United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) held in Baku, Azerbaijan on 11-22 November 2024 that will contribute significantly to addressing environmental and climate related global challenges;

Commending role of parliamentary diplomacy in strengthening multilateral cooperation in Asia and underscoring commitment of the APA Member States to address all aspects of the critical issue of multilateral cooperation.

Acknowledging that effective parliamentary cooperation is essential for providing legislative support to enhance economic collaboration and interconnectivity in Asia;

Hereby:

Reaffirm our commitment to the Charter of the United Nations, the universally recognized norms and principles of international law and to the Charter of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly;

Support the strengthening of multilateralism and **advocate** for more efficient, inclusive and transparent global governance and an order based on international law;

Reject any unlawful political and economic pressure against any Member State, particularly those, whose nations are suffering from the negative consequences of unilateral coercive measures at political, economic and social levels;

Mobilize all efforts to promote peace in Asia through the peaceful resolution of disputes, by providing assistance to conflict affected populations and by encouraging the safe and dignified return of displaced persons;

Recognize the repeated appeals by the Western Azerbaijani Community to engage in dialogue for the return to their ancestral homes in Armenia, as enshrined in various international human rights instruments, and mobilize all efforts to ensure the safe and dignified return of these displaced Azerbaijanis.

Urge all parties to fully comply with international law, including international humanitarian law, and call for withdrawal of Israeli forces from the occupied Palestinian territory;

Request the UN and the international community to substantially scale up the delivery of humanitarian relief to Gaza, to rebuild infrastructure and to rehabilitate the people of Gaza:

Reject categorically any foreign plans/initiatives regarding the future of Palestine and post-war Gaza, which are the absolute rights of the Palestinian people.

Reiterate strong support for the establishment of an independent and sovereign State of Palestine with its capital Al Quds and the right to return as mentioned in the UN General Assembly Resolution 194.

Unite efforts and **enhance** cooperation in a collective fight against terrorism, extremism, separatism, xenophobia, islamophobia, racism, crime in the sphere of ICT, transnational organised crime, trafficking in human being and illicit drug trafficking illicit trafficking in weapons, cultural property and other goods, illegal exploitation and trafficking of natural resources and money-laundering;

Exhort APA Member Parliaments to collaborate and take necessary measures to promote the development of ICT infrastructure through enabling policies, capacity building and building confidence and security in the use of ICTs;

Call upon APA Member Parliaments to promote strong inter-parliamentary cooperation and meaningful engagement of women and youth in their working;

Encourage targeted activities to foster intercultural and interfaith dialogue and exchange in Asia, including through active engagement in Baku Process and Peace4culture Global Campaign;

Encourage enhanced dialogue and cooperation in the areas of culture, sport and tourism among the APA Member Countries;

Underline the importance of fostering economic relations and trade channels to strengthen regional interconnectivity and support regional transport and digital connectivity projects;

Urge Asian governments to improve the implementation of SDG's and to adopt policy approaches to develop a comprehensive and innovative growth strategies needed to sustain a resilient, balanced, sustainable and inclusive economic growth;

Further urge APA Member Parliaments to redouble efforts in supporting activities to eradicate poverty, reduce inequality, ensure food security, access to healthcare and education, including by developing and implementing effective policies;

Invite APA member Parliaments to develop cross-sectoral collaboration for the advancement of health equity in Asia and adopt policies and measures to improve health care services and social protection systems;

Call for improving alternative energy resources, emphasizing the importance of renewable and low-emission energy and energy efficiency in achieving sustainable development and protecting the environment, including through involving investments in infrastructure and the use of environment-friendly, innovative technology;

Invite APA Member Parliaments to proceed with legislation and other legal actions deemed relevant for integrating climate policies into broader development policies and urge their respective governments to implement projects in line with the measures outlined their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and the Paris Agreement as appropriate;

Note the adoption of the Baku Climate Unity Pact at the 29th session of the Conference of the Parties to the UNFCCC in November 2024 and **commend** the COP29 Presidency's global initiatives aimed at enabling impactful climate action;

Acclaim with great satisfaction the expansion of the ranks of the Asian Parliamentary Assembly and welcome the full membership of the Sultanate of Oman, as well as the granting of Observer status to the Republic of Belarus.

Support the crucial decision by the Plenary of the APA regarding equal payment and equal voting rights, recognize that the APA budget is essential for its effective functioning and a critical concern for all Member States, and call on all Member States to take the necessary measures to allocate the required funds.

Welcome the unanimous endorsement of the Kingdom of Bahrain for the 2026 term and the Islamic Republic of Iran for the 2027-2028 term as the APA President, and **emphasize** the significance of this momentous occasion in the historic city of Baku, reflecting confidence in their ability to advance the noble objectives of the APA through effective parliamentary diplomacy.

Express gratitude to Azerbaijan for its warm, gracious and efficient hospitality in hosting the Fifteenth Plenary session of the APA in Baku.

Amendments to the APA Charter

Article 8: Number of Votes

In the Plenary, each member parliament shall have one vote and has two delegates plus additional delegates determined as follows:

- Countries with population between 1 million up to 50 million will have two additional delegates,
- Countries with population between 50 and 200 million will have three additional delegates,
- Countries with population between 200 and 500 million will have four additional delegates, and
- Countries with population over 500 million will have five additional delegates,

Article 5: Basic Organs and Structures:

A: Basic APA Organs:

The APA shall be composed of the Plenary, the Executive Council, the Bureau of Assembly, the Standing Committees and the Secretariat.

Activities of the APA Organs and establishment of subsidiary bodies shall be regulated by the APA Rules of Procedure.

B: Organizational Structure of the APA:

The organization of the hierarchy structure shall be arranged in a democratic manner indicating clearly the specific composition, function, powers and Rules of Procedure to reach balance, harmony and effectiveness of the APA work, as an institution, all, shall be subject to the approval of the Plenary.

Amendments to the APA Rules of Procedure

IV: Standing Committees and Sub-Committees:

Rule 15:

- The Plenary may set up Standing Committees and Sub-Committees as it deems necessary to deal with any subject of interest and to examine the issues on its agenda. These bodies shall submit as appropriate their draft resolutions, reports and recommendations to the Plenary for its consideration and decision.
- 2. The APA shall have four Standing Committees on: Political Affairs, Economic and Sustainable Development, Social and Cultural Affairs, Budget and Planning. Decisions of the Standing Committees shall be taken by consensus. Any other issues of interest are to be considered within the scope of sub-committees under direct supervision of the relevant Standing Committee
- 3. Upon suggestion of the Bureau or at least ten Member Parliaments, establishment of Sub-Committees, shall be put on the agenda of the Executive Council for its approval. The recommendation of the Executive Council on this issue shall be approved by the majority votes of the delegates present and voting in the Plenary.

Rule 34:

Each member parliament shall have one vote.

The nomination of the Kingdom of Bahrain, the State of Qatar, and the Russia Federation were endorsed by the EC for the post of APA vice - Presidency for the year 2025 and recommended to the 15th APA Plenary.

7. Request of Sultanate of Oman for APA full membership Sultanate of Oman on 12 September 2024 officially requested for APA full membership. The Executive Council unanimously approved the Application of the Sultanate of Oman for full membership and recommended to the 15th Plenary. The delegation of Oman expressed its appreciation and offered its

full solidarity and support towards promotion of APA objective. (Attachment IV)

8. Request of the Republic of Belarus for APA observer status

The Republic of Belarus on 10 October 2024 officially requested for APA observer status. The APA Secretary General presented a brief report to EC and stated that the Executive Council in its meeting in November 2023 in Antalya, Türkiye, decided to stablish the "Committee on Palestine" and called-on 14th APA Plenary to approve it. The first meeting of the Committee was held on January 10, 2024 in Tehran, Islamic Republic on Iran. The Second meeting of the Committee was held on the sidelines of the APA Standing Committee on Political Affairs in Baghdad on January 12, 2025. (Attachment VI)

11. Report on activities of Working Group on Statutory Documents

The chairperson of the Executive Committee presented the report of the WG on Statutory Documents. He stated that at the meeting of the APA Working Group on Statutory Documents which was held on December 2024 in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain the proposed amendments to the Article 8 of the APA Charter were considered and adopted. Subsequently, at the WG meeting in January 2025 in Baghdad the proposed amendments to the Article 5 of the APA Charter and Rule 15 and Rule 34.1 of the APA Rules of Procedure were considered and adopted. The adopted texts of the reviewed Articles 5 and 8 and Rule 15 and 34.1 of the Rules of Procedure by WG, were presented by the APA Secretariat to the meeting. The EC considered and adopted the proposed text and recommended it to the 15th Plenary for the final approval.

By adoption of these amendments to the APA Charter and Rules of procedure, the Working Group on Statutory Documents has fulfilled its mandate. (Attachment VII)

12. Report on the Bureau Sessions

The representative of the Secretariat presented the Report. He stated that during the year 2024/2025, the APA Bureau had four sessions on the sidelines of the Standing Committee meetings in Moscow, Doha, Manama, and Baghdad. The reports of Bureau meetings were presented by APA Secretariat to the Executive Council for its consideration and approval. The EC approved the Reports of the Bureau. (Attachment VIII)

Report by the APA Secretary General

Mr. Chairman,

Distinguished Delegates,

Dear colleagues,

It is a great honor for me, as Secretary General, to address the APA Executive Council Meeting and present my report on the latest APA activities and the outcomes of the APA Standing Committees.

Before starting my report, let me congratulate you, Mr. Chairman, and the Milli Majlis of Azerbaijan for presiding over this important meeting. I am confident that, we will accomplish the objectives set for this meeting under your prudent and tactful leadership. Allow me once again to take this opportunity to express, on behalf of my colleagues in the APA Permanent Secretariat and myself, our deepest appreciation to the state officials and the Milli Majlis of Azerbaijan, for their gracious hospitality and excellent organization of the meeting in the magnificent city of Baku.

Mr. Chairman,

Distinguished Delegates,

Following successful holding of the 14th APA Plenary in Baku in February 2024 I am glad to report that, under the leadership of the APA President and the capable management of the APA Vice-Presidents and the Chairs-of the four Standing Committees, we were able to successfully hold the four Standing Committee meetings according to the schedule for the year 2024/2025.

Standing Committee Meetings:

- The meeting of the Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs, hosted by the State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation, was held on 25-28 September 2024 in Moscow. Sixteen parliamentary delegations from member countries participated in this meeting. H.E. Boris Chernyshov, deputy chairman of the State Duma, chaired the meeting, and during the course of two sessions, 13 draft resolutions were updated and adopted by consensus. A new draft resolution on "Asian Parliamentarians in Support of a More Just Multipolar World Order Reflecting Its Cultural and Civilizational Diversity" was introduced as new draft resolution by the Russian delegation and adopted by consensus. The draft resolution on the "Commission on Women" was thoroughly debated at this session of the Committee and deferred to the next meeting for further debate. Under the item of "Situation of Women Parliamentarians in Asia," the Deputy Chair of the Federation Council Committee on Science, Education, and Culture of Russian Federation, reported on the results of the IV Eurasian Women's Forum in St. Petersburg, Russia (18-20 September 2024). The Chair of the State Duma Committee on Family Protection also presented her statement on the defense of traditional values.
- The second event was the meeting of the Standing Committee on **Budget and Planning**, which was held on 4-7 November 2024 in Doha, at the invitation of the Shura Council of the State of Qatar, and chaired by H.E. Mr. Ahmad bin Hitmi AL-Hitmi in the capacity of APA Vice-President. Parliamentary delegations from 15 member countries participated in this meeting. The *draft resolution on Budget & Planning* was extensively debated with all proposed amendments and adopted by consensus. The meeting finally agreed on an equal amount of 22,000 USD as annual contribution. It was emphasized that the sum of 22,000 USD is a fair amount with no pressure on any member country, and voluntary contributions by certain wealthier members can also be taken into consideration.
- The meeting of the Standing Committee on **Economic and Sustainable Development,** as the third Standing Committee meeting, was held on 8-9 December 2024 in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain. The meeting was hosted by the Council of Representatives of the Kingdom of Bahrain and chaired by H.E. Mr. Ahmad Alsaloom in his capacity as APA Vice-President. Parliamentary delegations from 18 member countries participated in this meeting and presented

their remarks on regional and global developments, as well as on the content of draft resolutions. There were 7 *draft resolutions* on the agenda of the meeting. These draft resolutions were considered and adopted after incorporating several amendments.

• Finally, at the invitation of the Iraqi Council of Representatives, the Standing Committee on **Political Affairs** was held on 11-12 January 2025 in Baghdad, Republic of Iraq, as the last Standing Committee meeting. Fourteen parliamentary delegations from APA member countries participated in this meeting, and H.E. Mr. Al-Kinani, head of the Iraqi delegation, presided over the meeting. The Standing Committee had before it 8 *draft resolutions* for consideration. After interactive discussions on proposed amendments to the draft resolutions, the meeting adopted all draft resolutions. Under the agenda item "General Debate," *many delegations addressed the unfolding disastrous situation in the Gaza Strip, expressing their full support for and solidarity with the Palestinian people*.

Distinguished Delegates,

In addition to the Standing Committee meetings during the year 2024-2025, the APA had four more major events:

1. Committee on Palestine

The APA Executive Council, in its meeting in November 2023 in Antalya, Türkiye, decided to establish the "Committee on Palestine" and called on the 14th APA Plenary to approve it. The first meeting of the Committee was held on January 10, 2024, in Tehran, Islamic Republic of Iran. The "Final Communique on the Current Situation in Palestine" was considered and adopted by consensus at this meeting. The second meeting of this Committee was held on the sidelines of the APA Standing Committee on Political Affairs in Baghdad on January 12, 2025. The meeting was opened by the Chair of the Committee, H.E. Ali Faysal, head of the delegation of Palestine, and participants made their remarks on the catastrophic situation of the Palestinian people in Gaza, expressing hope that a lasting and sustained ceasefire would be established in the region. The draft resolution on "Asian Parliament's Unwavering Support for the Palestinian People" was considered and adopted at this meeting.

2. Working Group on Statutory Documents

The APA Bureau, at its meeting in September 2024 in Moscow, decided that the WG would hold meetings in parallel with Standing Committee meetings. The first meeting of the WG took place on December 8, 2024, on the sidelines of the

Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain. The meeting was chaired by the Council of Representatives of the Kingdom of Bahrain and considered and agreed on proposed amendments to Articles 8 of the APA Charter. The issue of equal payment and equal voting rights was addressed and agreed upon by all participants.

The second meeting of the WG was held on January 11, 2025, on the sidelines of the Standing Committee on Political Affairs in Baghdad, Republic of Iraq. The WG, chaired by the Council of Representatives of Iraq, reviewed Article 5 of the Charter as well as Rule 15 of the Rules of Procedure. <u>It was agreed that there should only be four Standing Committees and that any other issues should be considered within the scope of sub-committees.</u>

3. Bureau Meetings

During the year 2024-2025, the APA Bureau, composed of the APA President, the four Vice-Presidents, and the APA Secretary General, had four sessions on the sidelines of the Standing Committee meetings in Moscow, Doha, Manama, and Baghdad. At these meetings, a wide range of issues related to APA activities were discussed, and several important decisions were made to facilitate the implementation of the APA annual program of work.

4. APA Coordination Meeting on the Sidelines of the IPU Assembly

As you are aware, the APA Coordination Meeting on the sidelines of the IPU Assemblies has been held since 2009 as a usual practice mandated under the APA Resolution adopted on November 2008. The resolution calls on the APA Secretariat to do its best to benefit from the IPU potential as a big parliamentary platform in favor of strengthening parliamentary diplomacy and as part of the initiative to deepen cooperation and coordination on important international issues of common interest. During the year 2024, the Coordination Meeting of the APA was held on the sidelines of the 148th IPU Assembly in March and the 149th IPU Assembly on October in Geneva, Switzerland, with participation of good number of lawmakers representing APA member parliaments. These two events were chaired by the Republic of Azerbaijan in its capacity as APA President.

Dear colleagues,

One key task of the Executive Council Meetings is **endorsing nomination of the new APA President**. Additionally, we must finalize nominations for APA Vice-Presidents to chair the four Standing Committees in 2025. I expect that, in the course of this Executive Committee meeting, we will be able to fulfill our obligation to finalize candidacies for the Presidency of 2026-2027 and the chairmanship of the four Standing Committees for 2025.

At this meeting of the Executive Council, we are pleased to address the **Application of the Sultanate of Oman full membership and the Republic of Belarus for Observer Status**. I warmly welcome them both and I am confident of their full support from APA member parliaments.

Before concluding, I once again express my heartfelt thanks to H.E. Ms. Sahiba GAFAROVA, Speaker of the Milli Majlis of Azerbaijan, and H.E. Mr. Rizvan Nabiyev, Representative of the APA President, and head of Azerbaijan delegation for their exemplary leadership as APA President.

Report on the Committee on Palestine

The APA Executive Council in its meeting in November 2023 in Antalya, Türkiye, decided to stablish the "Committee on Palestine" and 14th APA Plenary to approve it. The first meeting of the Committee was held on January 10, 2024 in Tehran, Islamic Republic on Iran. Parliamentary delegations from 17 member countries participated in the meeting.

The main topics underlined in the statements of the majority of the countries was the condemnation of the Israeli regime's aggression against the Palestinian people resulting in massacre of thousand civilians among them several thousand women and children, war crimes, Genocide, and crimes against humanity against the Gaza Strip. They also expressing concerns that the flames of evil actions of the Israeli regime will go beyond the borders of the occupied territories and the entire West Asian region faces a very serious challenge with dangerous consequences for world peace and security. The "Final Communique on the Current Situation in Palestine" was adopted by unanimity at this meeting.

The Second meeting of the Committee was held on the sidelines of the APA Standing Committee on Political Affairs in Baghdad on January 12, 2024. This meeting was opened by the Chair, H.E Mr. Ali Faysal, Head of Delegation of Palestine, who welcomed the participants and

asked them to observe one minute silence in memory of the martyrdom of the Palestinian People. The APA Secretary General also made an address on the tragic and painful situation of the people of Gaza and Lebanon. Participants also made their remarks on the catastrophic situation of the Palestinian people in Gaza and expressed that a lasting and sustained ceasefire would be established in the region. The draft resolution on "Asian Parliament's unwavering support for Palestinian People" was extensively addressed and adopted by participants.

Report on: APA Working Group on Statutory Documents

To accelerate the reform process, the APA Executive Council decided to establish a working group on Statutory documents in October 2019 in Rize, Türkiye.

As an initial step, parliament of Kuwait invited WG members in February 2020 to hold the first session of the WG. Unfortunately, the planned meeting in Kuwait was canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Two years later, in October 2021, the First Session of the WG was convened in Ürgüp, Türkiye. During the First Session, the participants could only address amendments of 5 Articles of the APA Charter.

It took nearly two years, from October 2021 to July 2023, for the Secretariat and the APA's term presidency to arrange the Second Session of the WG in July 2023 in Tehran.

Finally in an attempt to maintain momentum, the APA Bureau, at its meeting in September 2024 in Moscow, decided to hold WG sessions alongside the Standing Committee meetings.

Under the new approach, the first meeting of the WG took place on December 8, 2024, on the sidelines of the Standing Committee on Economic and Sustainable Development in Manama. The meeting considered and agreed on proposed amendments to Articles 8 of the APA Charter.

The second meeting of such WG was held on January 11, 2025, on the sidelines of the Standing Committee on Political Affairs in Baghdad. The WG reviewed Article 5 of the Charter as well as Rule 15 of the Rules of Procedure.

The Executive Council is to consider the revised texts of Articles 5 and 8 of the Charter and Rule 15 of the Rules of Procedure as proposed by the WG.

Once the 15th Plenary approves the final texts, the mandate of the WG on Statutory Documents will be exhausted.

Amendments to the APA Charter

Article 8: Number of Votes

In the Plenary, each member parliament shall have one vote and has two delegates plus additional delegates determined as follows:

- Countries with population between 1 million up to 50 million will have two additional delegates,
- Countries with population between 50 and 200 million will have three additional delegates,
- Countries with population between 200 and 500 million will have four additional delegates, and
- Countries with population over 500 million will have five additional delegates,

Article 5: Basic Organs and Structures:

A: Basic APA Organs:

The APA shall be composed of the Plenary, the Executive Council, the Bureau of Assembly, the Standing Committees and the Secretariat.

Activities of the APA Organs and establishment of subsidiary bodies shall be regulated by the APA Rules of Procedure.

B: Organizational Structure of the APA:

The organization of the hierarchy structure shall be arranged in a democratic manner indicating clearly the specific composition, function, powers and Rules of Procedure to reach balance, harmony and effectiveness of the APA work, as an institution, all, shall be subject to the approval of the Plenary.

Amendments to the APA Rules of Procedure

IV: Standing Committees and Sub-Committees:

Rule 15:

- 1. The Plenary may set up Standing Committees and Sub-Committees as it deems necessary to deal with any subject of interest and to examine the issues on its agenda. These bodies shall submit as appropriate their draft resolutions, reports and recommendations to the Plenary for its consideration and decision.
- 2. The APA shall have four Standing Committees on: Political Affairs, Economic and Sustainable Development, Social and Cultural Affairs, Budget and Planning. Decisions of the Standing Committees shall be taken by consensus. Any other issues of interest are to be considered within the scope of sub-committees under direct supervision of the relevant Standing Committee
- 3. Upon suggestion of the Bureau or at least ten Member Parliaments, establishment of Sub-Committees, shall be put on the agenda of the Executive Council for its approval. The recommendation of the Executive Council on this issue shall be approved by the majority votes of the delegates present and voting in the Plenary.

Rule 34:

Each member parliament shall have one vote.

Report of APA Bureau meetings

During the past few years as we proceeded to tackle our efforts for addressing the important topics of interests to all the APA members, it was strongly felt that there was an urgent need for a higher supervisory mechanism ever than before in order be able to streamline our decision-making process within the APA hierarchical structure.

There were issues and topics that by nature needed certain coordination or recommendation beforehand in order to be able to streamline the concerned activities, but could not be place in the Agenda of Standing Committees or that of other basic organs of APA.

To this end, the first meeting of APA Bureau was held on the sidelines of the Standing Committee on Social and Cultural Affairs in Moscow, Russian Federation with participation of Heads of delegations of Azerbaijan (as Representative of the APA President), Bahrain, Iraq, and Russian Federation in their capacity as APA Vice-Presidents as well as Secretary General.

Since then, APA Bureau has succeeded to hold 4 meetings on the sidelines of Committee Meetings and exchanged views on several valuable information and decisions of significance for smooth

operation and acceleration of the APA activities. Reports of the four Bureau meetings are hereto attached for your consideration.



Rapatkan Barisan, BKSAP Serukan Agar Parlemen Negara-Negara Asia Perkuat Multilateralisme

Baku, Azerbaijan (19/02/2025) – Ketua BKSAP DPR RI, Dr. Mardani Ali Sera, menyerukan agar parlemen negara-negara Asia untuk memperkuat hubungan baik dan kolaborasi bersama dalam menghadapi turbulensi geopolitik global. Hal ini disampaikan dalam Sidang Umum Asian Parliamentary Assembly (APA) ke-15 di Baku, Azerbaijan pada tanggal 19 Februari 2025.

Mardani menyoroti fenomena unilateralisme (mengambil tindakan sepihak) yang semakin meningkat dalam politik internasional. Sebagai contoh, sederetan kebijakan luar negeri yang dikeluarkan Amerika Serikat seperti menarik diri dari kesepakatan perubahan iklim Paris Agreement, keluar dari organisasi kesehatan dunia (WHO), usulan relokasi masyarakat Gaza secara sepihak, dan dikeluarkannya Eropa dan Ukraina dalam pembicaraan penyelesaian perang Russia-Ukraina.
