The expansion of commerce and economics, regional security, climate change and disaster risk, health epidemics, gender equality, and ocean governance are just a few of the pressing issues that the region must solve together. Collaborative efforts of such nature must support national interests and objectives, particularly those marked by a shared

commitment to values and traditions. Parliaments and Parliamentarians have the ability to actively participate in and influence the most important forces and changes impacting our region, with the goal of ensuring its continued prosperity and welfare.

This first session will provide a platform for elaborative statements from participants on national policies, ways and means, intervention required and already available to advance regional connectivity.

In this session, parliaments will address the following key issues :

- a. The role of parliaments and parliamentarians of the Pacific Island nations to drive partnership, cooperation, and collaboration by fostering regional connectivity and inclusive development that benefit people and the region
- b. Envisioning Pacific region as a region that is stable, prosperous, and resilient
- c. Embracing diversity among nations and respect its sovereignty, and prioritizing commitment to work together for driving sustainable economic prosperity and development for all

SESSION II: PANEL DISCUSSION ON CONNECTING OUR SEAS AND PEOPLE: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

Pacific countries are characterized by wide sea gaps between islands and archipelagos, as well as a relatively small land area inside a vast ocean. In the Pacific, the ocean and seas have become an essential component of daily life. To accomplish sustainable management and conservation, it is critical to understand the complex linkages that exist between society and water. Sharing access to the sea, port operations, and communications technology are critical in fostering regional cooperation and sustainable development in all aspects since they serve as entrance points to global trade. Parliaments and parliamentarians must also work to lessen the gap

between countries by promoting deeper people-to-people relations, cultural sharing, and the exchange of knowledge and values.

Discussions in this sub-theme will likely to evolve around these key issues:

- a. What are the opportunities and challenges for realizing the vision of connectivity in the Pacific region?
- b. The roles of cultures and arts in promoting closer interaction and engagement among countries in the Pacific region.
- c. Protecting ocean and environment while improving economic growth, and enhancing leadership to foster sea and people connectivity in the Pacific region.

Science and Techno Park (STP) Institute Pertanian Bogor (IPB) University is situated in Bogor, 60 km from Jakarta. This STP was established in 2015, managed by PT. Bogor Life Science & Technology (BLST), a holding company owned by IPB.

STP IPB is an area dedicated and professionally managed for the development of innovation, business incubation and technology transfer in order to develop and encourage sustainable economic growth. The focus areas developed by STP IPB are tropical agricultural, food, bioscience and marine products.

The presence of STP IPB is very much in line with IPB's 2019 - 2045 vision to "become a research-based university and be at the forefront of innovation for national independence towards a techno-socio entrepreneurial university that excels at the global level in the fields of agriculture, marine and tropical biosciences".

The Rector of the IPB University will welcome the Delegation at the Start-up Center Building where the Delegations can observe the best practices and make comparative study as well as to learn on establishing a start-up enterprise.

Rumah Kaca Anggrek Soedjana Kassan or Griya Anggrek Kebon Raya Bogor is an ex-situ plant conservation area for the preservation of species outside their natural habitat. This greenhouse is a place to collect various types of orchids, as well as a place for research, conservation, education and tourism.

Visitors can find collections of various types of orchids. The orchids kept are mainly native species, as well as crosses and hybrids, approximately 800 tribes and 4,000 genera, with more than 10,000 plants.

14.00 – 16.00 **Observation of Biodiversity Conservation at Kebon Raya Bogor**

Kebon Raya Bogor (Bogor Botanical Gardens) is a large botanical garden located in Bogor City, Indonesia. This garden is operated by the National Research and Innovation Agency (BRIN). This garden is located in the center of Bogor city and adjacent to the Bogor Palace presidential palace complex.

Kebon Raya Bogor was initially dedicated for an experimental garden of plantation crops which would be introduced in the Dutch East Indies. Later, Kebon Raya Bogor initiated the development of science in Indonesia and

developed as a forum for scientists, especially in the field of botany in Indonesia, in an organized manner at that time (1880 - 1905).

From Kebon Raya Bogor, several scientific institutions were born such as Bibliotheca Bogorencis (1842), Herbarium Bogoriense (1844), Kebon Raya Cibodas (1860), Treub Laboratory (1884), and the Zoological Museum and Laboratory (1894). Kebon Raya Bogor is now the model for 44 other botanical gardens throughout Indonesia.
