Today's webinar is one of many means of networking that SEAPAC can exercise during this hard time. This year's activity will be started by a topical Information Webinar about an international event: the UN General Assembly Special Session against Corruption (UNGASS).

As agreed by the UN GA through a resolution 73/191, the UN will convene, in the first half of 2021, a General Assembly Special Session against Corruption. It will discuss challenges and measures to prevent and combat corruption and strengthen international cooperation.

I believe UNGASS provides a stronger political impetus for the global anti-corruption movement. It is critical as we for this past year have been dealing with massive delivery of public money and programs specifically designed to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and recover from the resulting impact of such crisis.

But most of the time, many UN international agendas reserved only to the executives. While parliamentarians, as people who receive mandates and voices of the people are left behind.

SEAPAC believes that we should not leave anyone behind. Under GOPAC, we do have already contributed to the discussion for UNGASS. But we know that the more parliamentarians join the discussion... the more we can achieve. The more they know much about the UNGASS, the best we can prepare for actions beyond UNGASS.
